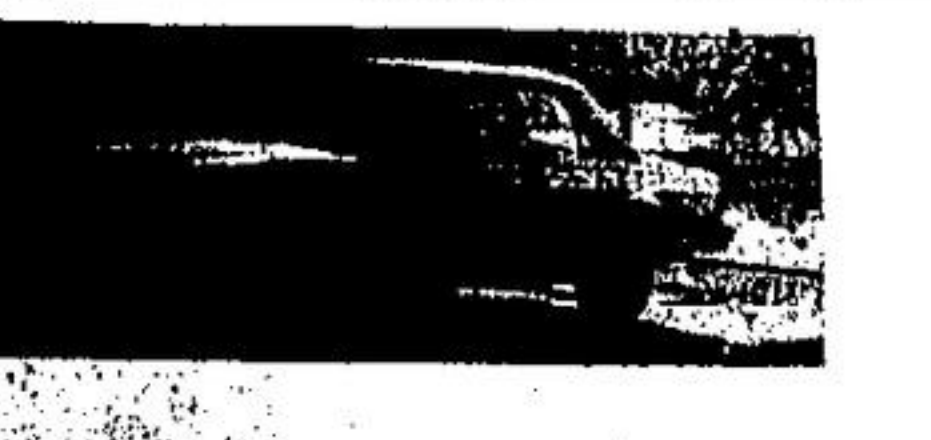

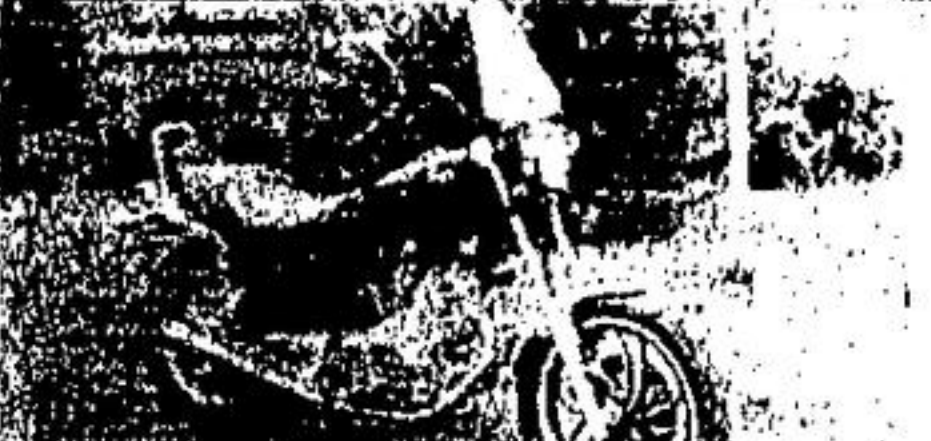

**Three week delay**

**Because Y proposal late**

Halton region has reopened the call for proposals for its three regional day care centres, including the Maple Avenue Day Care Centre in Georgetown.

Oct. 9, 2 p.m. is now the new closing date for proposals on what to do with these day care centres. The region is interested in proposals to lease or purchase any or all of them.

Although the region received two private for profit proposals for the regional day care centre in Georgetown when proposal calls closed Aug. 30 at 2 p.m., a third proposal, by the Central Ontario Y and YMCA of Metropolitan Toronto wasn't accepted.

Late by 16 minutes, the Y's proposal wasn't opened by the region's health and social services staff who recommended it be refused outright.

Refusing it, regional councillors however, decided to open the call for proposals for a second time, with the proposals already received from Diane Young and David Cromb returned to them for resubmission, as is or modified.

The main reason the region took this step was to allow the Y proposal to be submitted. This way doesn't violate regional bylaws and set a precedent of accepting late proposals or tenders for the future.
