Acton continues dominance

Acton A's continue to be a major force at home. Roy Spear tossed the win, going five innings. Spear allowed six hits while fanning five. Jim Schnarr came in relief and allowed five hits and fanned six in the four innings he worked.

"I thought Roy pitched well, considering he hasn't thrown a ball in over four weeks," said manager Steve Marshall.

Acton got on the scoreboard in the third trailing 1-0. Tim Baker had a base on balls and advanced when Gord McArthur singled. Both players scored on Spear's two-run single.

Rob Vermeulen had a double in the fourth inning and scored when Paul Cargill singled to make the score 3-1 Acton.

The A's added single runs in the fifth and seventh innings when Spear and Tim Baker hit solo homers. Fergus scored its last run of the game in the ninth inning.

The win at home added to an already impressive number this year. The A's haven't lost at home since being beaten by Guelph early in the season. Since then Acton has registered nothing but 16 wins when at Prospect Park.

That fact could enter in the A's final series with Glen Williams Specters, who needed extra innings to

defeat Orangeville in their playoff series 5-4 for a 2-1 series win Sunday at Glen Williams.

"It helps alot," Marshall said. "It could boil down to the fifth and final game because we've always had trouble at their field and they lost the three games they played on our field. But you never know."

"With the five games we've had this year it won't take a lot to get ready for this series," he said.

The championship series will have begun Tuesday night in Acton. The second game in the series will be played next Tuesday at the Glen Williams diamond.

Further games have not yet been scheduled.

Acton gym has "Olympic" flavor

ACTON-There is now an Olympic flavor present in the weight room at Acton High School.

The school has a new set of Olympic style weights and barbells to compliment its Universal unit. The new equipment has been set up with many students getting involved in the use.

The equipment came as the result of a presentation made by the athletic department after students had asked if they could bring in their own free weights.

"We found there was no control or storage place for them and since there was an interest we wondered if we could get some new weights," said athletic department head Bruce Andrews.

A presentation was made to the Teen Cuisine, and about \$4,000 was given in order to purchase the new weights and other equipment.

Teen Cuisine is the name of the Acton cafeteria, which is run by the school. Any profits made are put back into the school.

Also purchased were a preacher curl bench, a California squat rack, the Olympic weights, two Olympic bar-

bells, four sets of welded York barbells, five sets of welded dumbbells, two wall storage racks, a dumbbell rack and storage rack for the York and Olympic plates. As well a regulation competition bench press and incline bench were obtained.

Protection for the room floor was needed so 11 4 by 8 plywood sheets 3/4 inches thick were secured by metal brackets and covered with indoor-outdoor carpet. Also, to ensure the new equipment wasn't stolen or used without supervision a cage was built where the new weights are kept.

With the new weights, interest has increased at the school so much that a weight club has been formed. The students are charged \$5 for membership, which entitles them to use the new weights. All students can use the Universal free. Members are given shoe tags.

There is a sign-in and out sheet that monitors who has what equipment. At all times there must be a teacher present for members to use the equipment.

Upon forming the club, Andrews gave the new members a mini course. To date over 80 students have joined the club.

"I think the reaction has been very positive," Andrews said. "The kids have been very cooperative."

Andrews said there are bigger plans in store for the club and weight room facility.

"I'd like to form a club executive to review procedures of how everything is working out," he said. "Also we'd like to get an open vertical storage area for the students in the weight room for their bags."

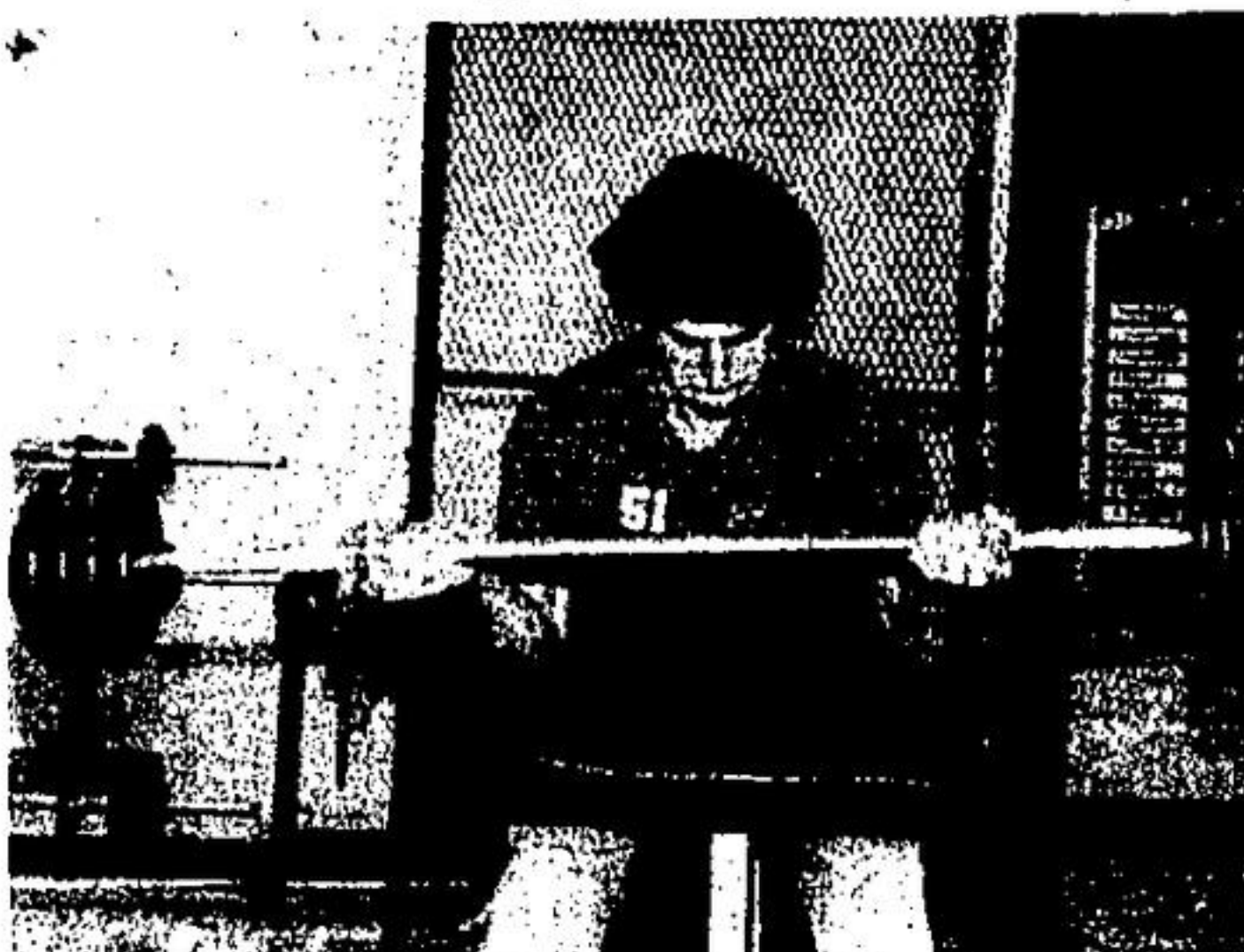

Football finalists decided

The best in the West had convincing wins over the best in the East Sunday to set up a climactic final game between O'Tooles and Dairy Queen this weekend. Dairy Queen rolled over Delrex Smoke Shop 42-21 and O'Tooles crushed Corrigan Instrument 51-21.

O'TOOL'S VS CORRIGAN

Throughout the league this year there has been talk of the decline of O'Tooles. Their will and ability to play at a customarily high level were always questioned. Well, it didn't come as a surprise to more astute observers that O'Tooles re-discovered their prodigious power for the playoffs. They have every intention of setting a new GFFL record of four straight MacLaren Cups and they took a big step toward that goal Sunday.

The magnitude of the win becomes better appreciated when you consider their opposition. Corrigan is a good team - the best in the East. But for this game at least they weren't in the same league as O'Tooles.

Rick Baldwin was at his uncanny best as he shredded the Corrigan defence with precision passing that would make Joe Montana envious. His prime target wasn't a Russel or Allan or Karoldas but Robin Rivers. Rivers stole the spotlight from his more illustrious mates to record four TDs and a two-pointer. James Allan wasn't forgotten. He added a pair of majors, one on a spectacular 70-yard pass-and-run play. Steve Peace had a TD and two-pointers were tallied by Bill

Rivers (2) and John Karoldas.

Corrigan hit for two TDs in the first half, one by rookie of the year hopeful Hugo Dittach and scoring leader Brent Fergusson. Mike Peirce, who displayed gazelle-like speed throughout, scored Corrigan's only major in the second half. Fergusson added two points with a convert.

DAIRY QUEEN VS SMOKE SHOP

Dairy Queen continued their coolly proficient play by dispatching old nemesis Delrex Smoke Shop. Their finely tuned offence was complimented by an equally solid defence.

Dairy Queen charged out to take a 24-9 first half lead on two TDs by Howie Hulme and a third by Stu Lunn. Ron Lunn, Randy Lunn and Steve Crossman chalked up two-pointers. Hulme

continued his fine play in the second half with his third TD. Gary Lockwood and Ron Lunn also scored majors. The Queen defence, intent on claiming their share of the glory for the win, had three interceptions by Hulme, Lockwood and Mitch Leblanc.

Smokers, though twice the gae of some of their DQ tormentors, could only score half as many points. Bruce Cartwright had two majors and Werner (clutch) Mikoliet added TD number 35 to his lifetime total. Other DQ Smoker plays were by Terry Dardichuk who snared a two-pointer and Steve (Kamikaze) Frost who powered his imposing bulk 60-yards through DQ ranks on a kickoff return. Smoke Shop promises to be back next year for the 10th anniversary.

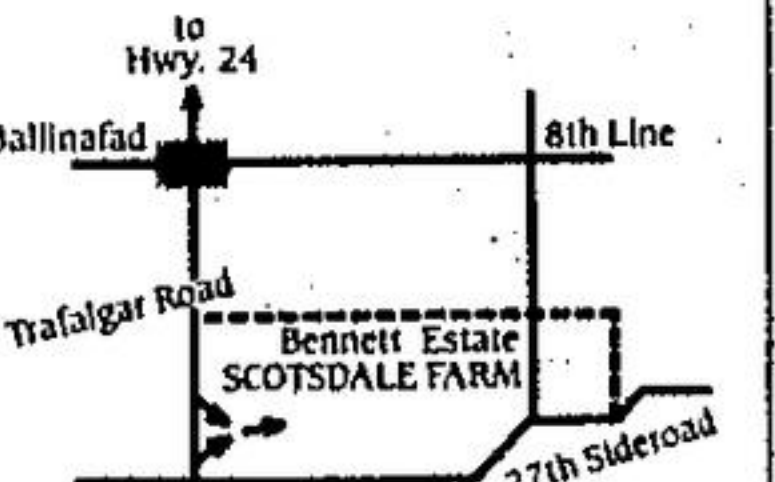
