Acton teachers picking up tips





Struggling authors suffer under tax says chief librarian

Some day you may be paying Canadian authors for their books you take out of the public library, said Betsy Cornwell, chief librarian at the Georgetown Library. It's called a public lending rate.

You would not pay directly but through a national fund like Canada Art Council from which money would be taken and given to authors whose books are popular in libraries.

Some Canadian authors believe they should be rewarded for books which become public property and are read over and over but are only paid for once. "They are robbed of the fruits of their labor. It's like a contravention of a

copyright," Mrs. Cornwell said. The Canadian government would choose different libraries, probably city libraries, to monitor circulation of Canadian books. Money given to

authors would be based on that circulation. "It wouldn't be a problem at the Georgetown library to keep such records because we are computerized, but I don't think we would be picked,"

Mrs. Cornwell said. She also said she didn't support the idea because the struggling authors whose books are seldom read would not receive much money. Only the authors

who are already making a good living would benefit because their books sell and are widely circulated at libraries. Authors in one Scandinavian country country, Britain and Australia receive money from public lending right programs. Some British authors refuse the money because they make enough and would like to see poor writers

get it, Mrs. Cornwell said. There is not much chance now of authors receiving a public lending right under the Conservative government, Mrs. Cornwell said. "They (Canadian authors) felt they were getting close under the Liberal government," she added.
