## Exchange promotes world peace

If you are between 15 and 18 years of age and have a sense of adventure then the exchange student program offered by Interculture Canada may be of interest to you.

Interculture Canada is a non-profit charitable organization which operates in 65 countries spanning five continents. The program offers students the opportunity to continue their secondary school education, learn another language and discover a different culture while sharing their daily lives with a local host family.


Al McFarlane, President of the volunteer committee responsible for the Metro Toronto area, pointed out that students who participate in the program return with a "great cultural experience". At present there are approximately 120 Canadian students studying in other countries and 150 students from over 30 countries learning in Canada.

Mr. McFarlane explained that after World War One the American Field Service which was an organization of ambulance drivers, began the program in order to promote world peace. They decided that the best way to achieve their goal would be to allow the most adaptable people, children, to learn about other countries through firsthand experience.

Once the country is chosen and a student is matched with a host family the process of assimilation begins. The student spends one day familiarizing himself with his new country at home and 3 days in his new country. While in their new countries the students are not left to fend for themselves. Counsellors, usually volunteers are available for consultation.

The program requires a \$5,200 dollar participation fee and bursaries are available for those who cannot afford the whole amount. The fee includes travel, medical insurance and \$20 to \$50 pocket money a week. For those countries

beginning their school year in January, February or March the deadline for applications is October 25, 1985. For more information on the program contact Al Mc-Farlane at 293-2401.
