

Rebel runners peaking

Georgetown District High School cross-country Rebels seem to be peaking at the right time.

With the Halton championships today at Kelso, the team took home the overall title Thursday at the Oktoberfest meet. It was held at Chicopee ski hill in Kitchener and Georgetown outdistanced rival O'Neill Collegiate of Oshawa by 11 points for the title.

The Rebels took top honors in the overall boys class over O'Neill (12 points) and were second in the girls category by the slimmest of margins. O'Neill won the class by a single point over the local team as St. Mary's of Kitchener had to settle for third spot just a point behind the Rebels.

The midget boys won their class as Bob Donker finished fourth overall in the field of 480 runners in 18:42. David Scida was fifth (18:44) while Glen Mulder finished seventh (19:01). Cam Herman came in 12th (19:18) while Tim Parker finished up in 146th (22:26).

The junior boys also topped their category as Jeff Amato finished ninth individually in 21:44. Teammate Dave Paul was right behind in 10th (21:48) while Greg McKenzie was 12th (21:57). Brendan Cleary was 25th (22:32). Other finishers for the Rebels were Yanne LeTarnec (32nd), Paul Tufford (55th), Mark Lamb (88th), Terry Dixon (93rd), Peter Ramsay (145th) and Richard Vanderwal (134th).

The senior boys squad finished second overall despite Rebel Erik Hopkins' winning the senior race in

24:02. Mike Wood finished 15th in the 480 man field (25:22) while Jim Clark was 26th (26:06). Other finishers include Brian Doherty (47th), Brian Hanman (75th) and Alan Bray (199th).

No results for the GDHS girls were available.

Acton High School also competed in the meet. Tamara Reynolds finished 132nd in the midget girls race while Sabrina Papp was 167th in the junior girls event.

David Boyle was 59th in the midget

boys race while Duncan Noble (223) and Mike Caspar (359) also ran. Darryl Bartlett was 125th in the junior boys race while Tristan Sones (202), Geoff DeJong (290), Mike Howarth (310) and Ernie Hollis (324) ran.

Simon Entwistle (38), John DeJong (115) and Chris Ashworth (179) competed in the senior race.
