## Rainstorms no fun for these residents

Getting your basement flooded everytime there's a severe rainstorm is no fun, as residents on Raylawn Crescent, Duncan Drive, Pennington Crescent, Airedale Court, Faludon Drive, Delrex Boulevard, Mountainview Road South, Irwin Crescent and Chelvin Crescent will agree.

The morning and afternoon rainstorms Aug. 26 left their effects with nearly 50 mm of rainfall on these residents.

For Raylawn Crescent and Duncan Drive area residents, flooding should soon be a thing of the past. Halton region is to begin replacing sections of sanitary sewer main next month.

Following a series of investigations, regional staff were able to zoom in on the reason for basement floodings for these residents. The sanitary sewer mains were surcharging.

For residents of the Mountainview Road South area, the regional investigators are out scratching their heads over the reasons for flooding. When they identify where the problem originates and how it can be solved, the region will take on its responsibility to solve the flooding.

The rest of the streets named above appear to have storm water flooding problems. Regional staff don't think it has anything to do with the sanitary sewers. Together with Halton Hills staff, regional staff have entered into preliminary investigations and discussions to determine a likely cause for the floodings and how they can be prevented.

The General Meeting of the Georgetown Hospital Auxillary was held Oct. 16 at the Bennett Health Care Centre. Reports indicated the volunteers have been very busy. 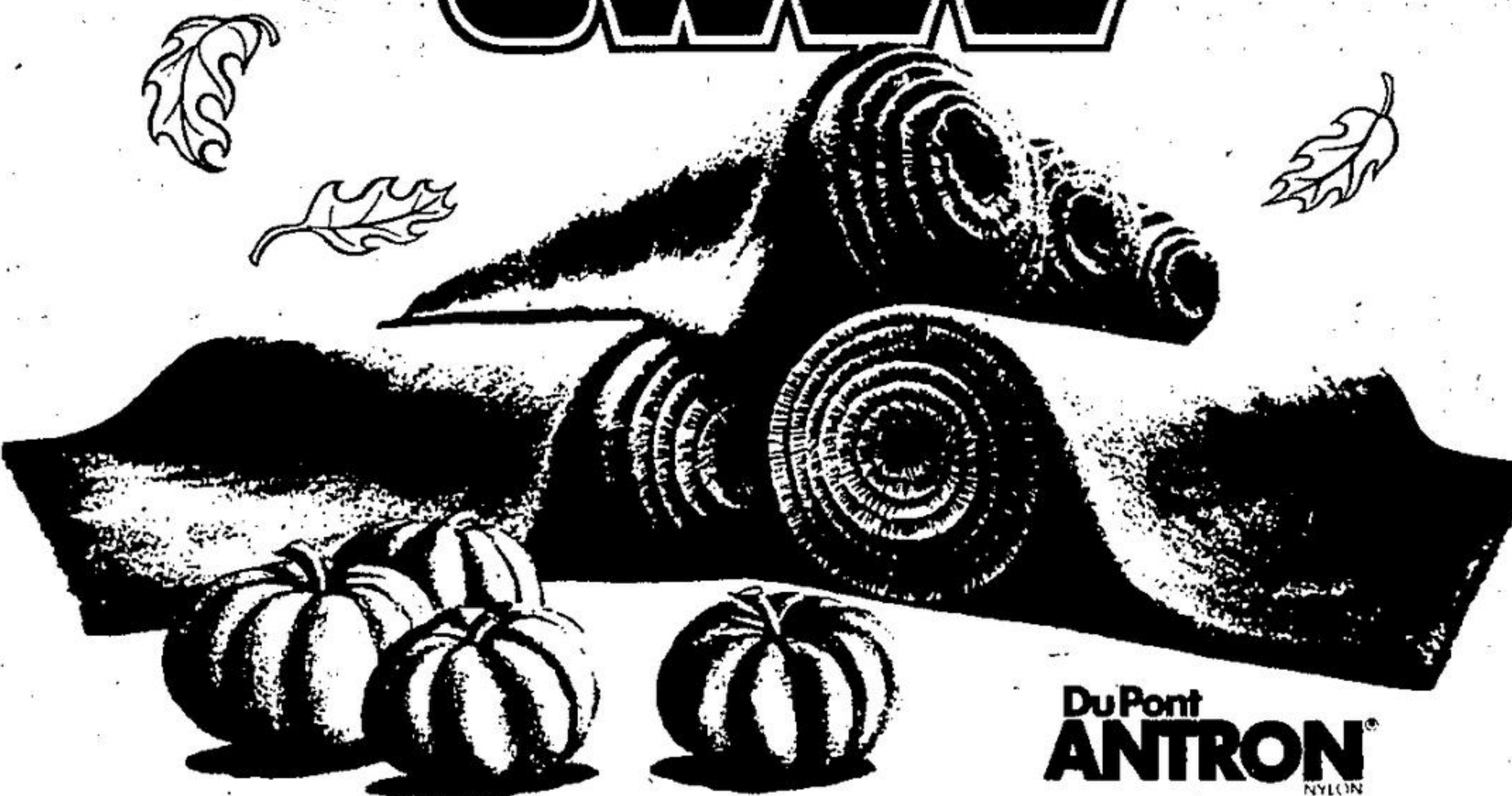
