5 car thefts

A car stereo was stolen Saturday from a locked car parked at Achilles Motors at 357 Queen St. in Acton. International Bible Students Association

No tax exemption Supreme Court rules

An Ontario Supreme Court Justice has refused The International Bible Students Association of Canada's application for exemption from property taxation on their national headquarters west of Georgetown and on their farm in Erin township.

Business and property taxes on the 83 acre headquarters site and 280 acre farm are estimated at \$250,000 annually.

The application was based on the section of the Assessment Act which exempts properties used as a seminary maintained for religious purposes.

Justice Janet Boland found the limiting provisions in the Assessment Act provide the grounds and buildings must be used and occupied by the seminary and not for the purposes of the seminary.

Justice Boland said the real purpose of the Halton Hills property is administrative as are the buildings which house the organization's national headquarters and printing centre.

If the Halton Hills land is not a seminary then the farmland cannot be used in connection with a seminary.

The applicants had said the seminary was part of a national and worldwide network of districts, circuits and congregations which provided the organizational framework for carrying out the applicant's primary purpose of religious education, the applicants said.

The headquarters site is an essential part of the organization because it provides all direction, guidance and administration as well as printed material necessary for this religious

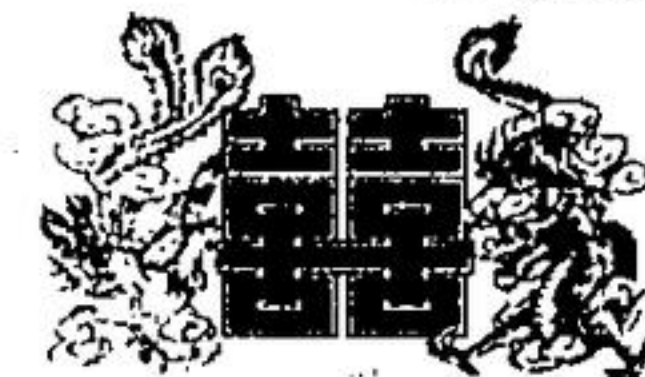
Stockup for season

Favourite Recipes

EGGS ON CURRIED RICE

1 1/2 cups brown rice
2 tbsp. butter
2 tbsp. whole wheat flour
2 1/4 cups beef stock
1 tsp. chopped chives
1/2 tsp. dried thyme
2 tsp. curry powder
4 eggs
2 tbsp. chopped parsley
Cook rice according to preferred method. Preheat oven to 350°F. Pack 'cooked' rice firmly into a buttered baking dish. Make four little wells, evenly spaced, about 1 inch deep, on the surface of the rice. Melt butter in a saucepan, add flour, stirring, and then add beef stock, stirring constantly. Cook until thickened. Add herbs and curry powder. Spoon approximately 1 cup of the sauce over the rice into the wells. Break an egg into each well, gently spoon the remaining sauce over the entire surface and bake for 25 minutes, or until eggs are firm. Garnish with parsley and serve. Serves 4.
