Couple dislike Sec. 63

Town council has received a letter objecting to the implementation of Section 63 in 1988.

Kay and Vern McCumber of Georgetown said it was "grossly unfair" of council to raise their taxes without proper justification or advance knowledge.

The Ward 3 residents said their ward hasn't received any special treatment. Section 63 is a market value assessment system of taxation that 80 per cent of the province has changed to. removed, is piled up on our sidewalk practically to our door. The boulevard across the street is never cut. This faces our front windows."

The McCumbers have owned their Chapel Street home since 1944 and said they are "bitterly disappointed" in council's decision.


