Avoid being towed

Police warn motorists to obey the parking bylaws during the winter to assist snow removal workers. They are asking motorists to park in their driveways to avoid getting tickets or being towed away.

Reverse into trouble

An Acton man driving a 1981 Datsun reversed into an Acton woman's 1977 Oldsmobile eastbound on the school lane at Main Street North Nov. 17 at 11:10 a.m., police said. Damage to the Oldsmobile was \$800 and \$200 to the Datsun.

Bug rear-ended

A Cambridge man's 1984 Volkswagen received \$3,000 damage when it was rear ended by a Milton man's 1981 GMC Saturday at 2:20 p.m. on Steeles Avenue at the Eighth Line, police said. Damage to the GMC was \$1,000.

Driveway mishap

A Georgetown woman driving a 1981 AMC hit a Milton woman's 1983 Datsun which turned into a driveway in front of the AMC Nov. 20 at 3:05 p.m. The accident happened on Regional Road 9 at the Sixth Line, and caused \$1,500 damage to the Datsun and \$600 damage to the AMC.

Two cars collide

A Mississauga man driving a 1984 Honda was hit by a Georgetown man's 1979 Ford entering traffic from a driveway on Guelph Street at Mountainview Road. The accident happened Nov. 18 at 10:06 a.m. Damage to the Ford was \$600 and \$1,300 to the Honda.

Lost control

A Burlington woman lost control of her 1979 Toyota while southbound on a slushy Guelph Street Friday at 11 a.m. She crossed over into the northbound lane and into a Georgetown man's 1976 Chevrolet. Damage to both cars was estimated at \$1,000.

\$1,000 damage

After causing \$1,000 damage to a Brampton man's 1984 Chevrolet the driver of a 1975 Marquis drove off Monday at 5:30 p.m. The Brampton man was eastbound on Guelph Street near the Sinclair Avenue when the Marquis made a left turn in front of him causing the Brampton man to swerve and mount the curb on Sinclair, police said.

Slid into signs

A wet road contributed to a Georgetown woman going wide on a turn and hitting two road signs Tuesday at 9:40 a.m. She was travelling east on Sideroad 22 at Highway 25 when she did the \$1,500 damage to her 1977 Ford. Damage to the signs totalled \$100.

Drove off road

Roadside slush on Winston Churchill Boulevard at the Fifth Sideroad caused a Brampton woman to drive her 1981 Buick off the road and into a ditch Friday at 11:30 a.m. Damage to the Buick was estimated at \$3,500.

To fix
Sloping yard costs \$45,000

Regional councillors from Oakville and Burlington were incredulous that repair works required at a Metcalfe Court residence could be so high.

"We're spending all that money on a private person's residence?" Oakville Coun. Keith Bird exclaimed at last week's regional administration and finance committee meeting. "For what property? How big is this property?"

Actually, the region isn't spending any money on the home at 45 Metcalfe Court. It's merely agreeing to be designated the "benefiting municipality" so that the emergency work required to stabilize the foundation in which this home has been built, can be eligible for a Ministry of Natural Resources grant.

As Regional Chairman Peter Pomeroy explained to his fellow councillors from the south, this Metcalfe Court home "is just one of a bunch of them" built on what's suspected to be fill, so that its back yard is sliding into the Silvercreek ravine.

The Ministry has said the project is eligible for a provincial grant of 55 per cent in 1986, for fixing the homeowner's rear yard and foundation problems.

Estimated to cost \$45,000, the rest of the project (\$23,250) is to be the homeowner's responsibility.

In a complicated piece of legal work, the town recently agreed to pay the 45 per cent share of the project, which the region is also expected to do today (Wednesday) at its council meeting. Although becoming the "benefiting municipality" as far as the Ministry is concerned, the town and the region have made it clear the homeowner is to actually pay the \$22,250. A bylaw was passed specifying this.

Many home on Irwin Crescent, Dawson Crescent, Eden Place and

Metcalfe Court have experienced slope failures, some to a greater degree than others. The town has spent \$26,500 for geotechnical investigations by the Credit Valley Conservation Authority.

These investigations identified the home at 45 Metcalfe Court as being in jeopardy of failure should groundwater

get as high as the levels of last spring. "If remedial work is not done now, there's a very strong possibility this house would end up at the bottom of the ravine by the spring," Halton Hills Coun. Mike Armstrong said, adding already there's a one inch gap in the basement of the home.
