Lawyer Dick Howitt vies for vice-chairman post

If no one decides to challenge Dick Howitt who wants to be the next vice-chairman of the Halton Board of Education then he will be acclaimed at the board's meeting tomorrow night.

The trustee of Wards 3 and 4 and three-year member of the board announced his intentions to run for vice-chairman at an informal meeting of the board two weeks ago.

"I'm ready for a step up. I think I can make a contribution as vice-chairman. I see it as increasing my experience as a member of the board because you become involved in executive meetings," he said.

He does not believe the job will interfere significantly with his duties in Wards 3 and 4 or with his law practice. He will have to cut down the number of committees he sits on which is now 8 or 9, he said. That time will be devoted to executive meetings.

As vice-chairman, Trustee Howitt will have to represent the board at
