Instead of pocketing any money from their first week of renting movie videos and VCR machines, the Georgetown couple gave the money away to charity.

The owners of Downtown Video on 98A Main St. South in Georgetown made \$284 from Dec. 2-7 rentals. They added \$216 of own money so that five service clubs could be given a cheque for \$100 each.

Saturday at their store, Mayor Russ Miller thanked the owners. Representatives from the Optimists, Lions, Kinsmen, Jaycees and Big Brothers came to accept the donation.

The service clubs were chosen at random, the owners say. The idea to support community projects from their opening week's business was attractive to them, because their clientele will be from the area, the couple say.

The new video store already has

1,000 different video films ready to rent out in VHS. The store has a wide variety of different movies, but the owners pride themselves in their family type of selection, the classic movies, old musicals and a children's section where the younger ones can watch cartoons.

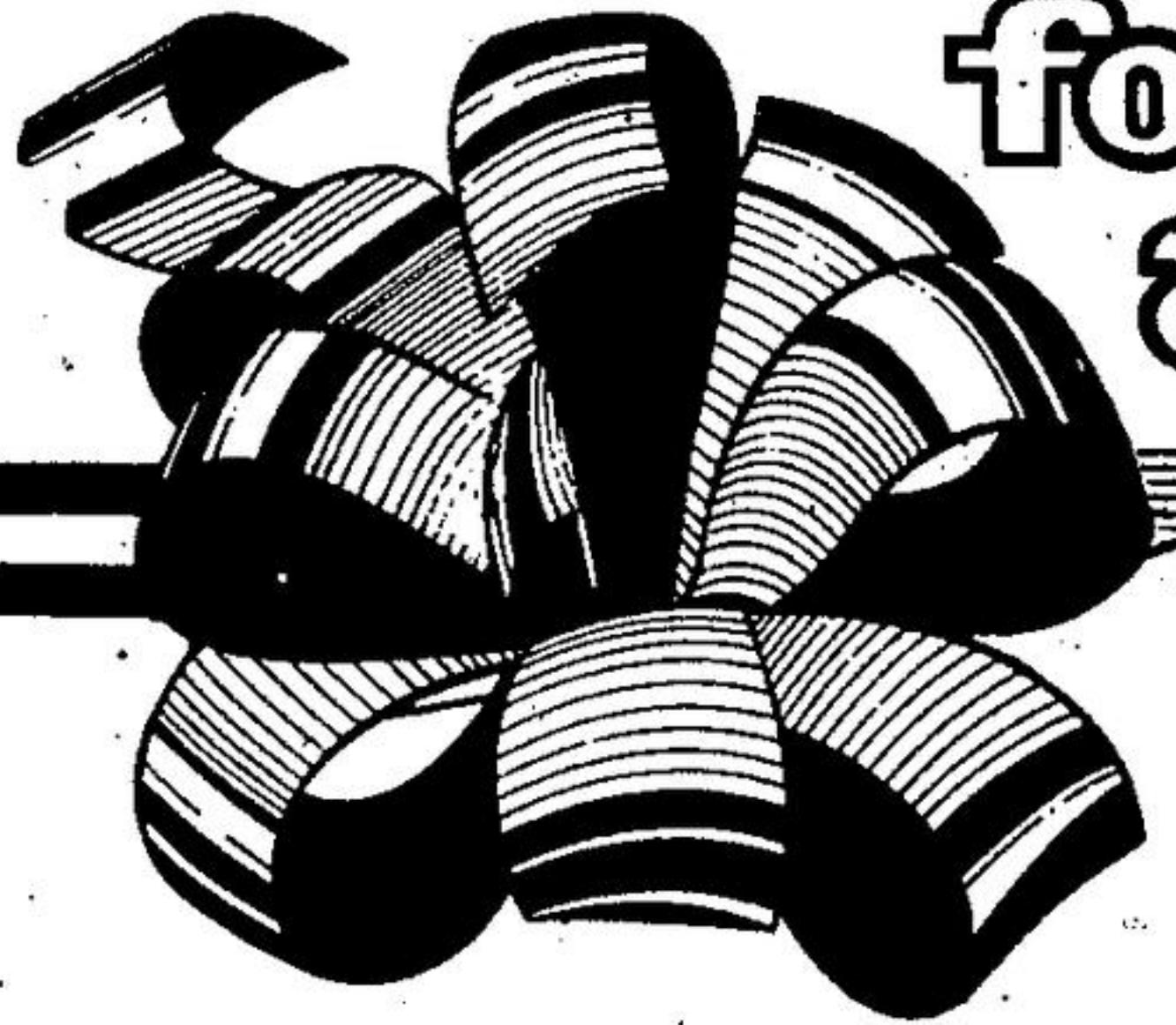

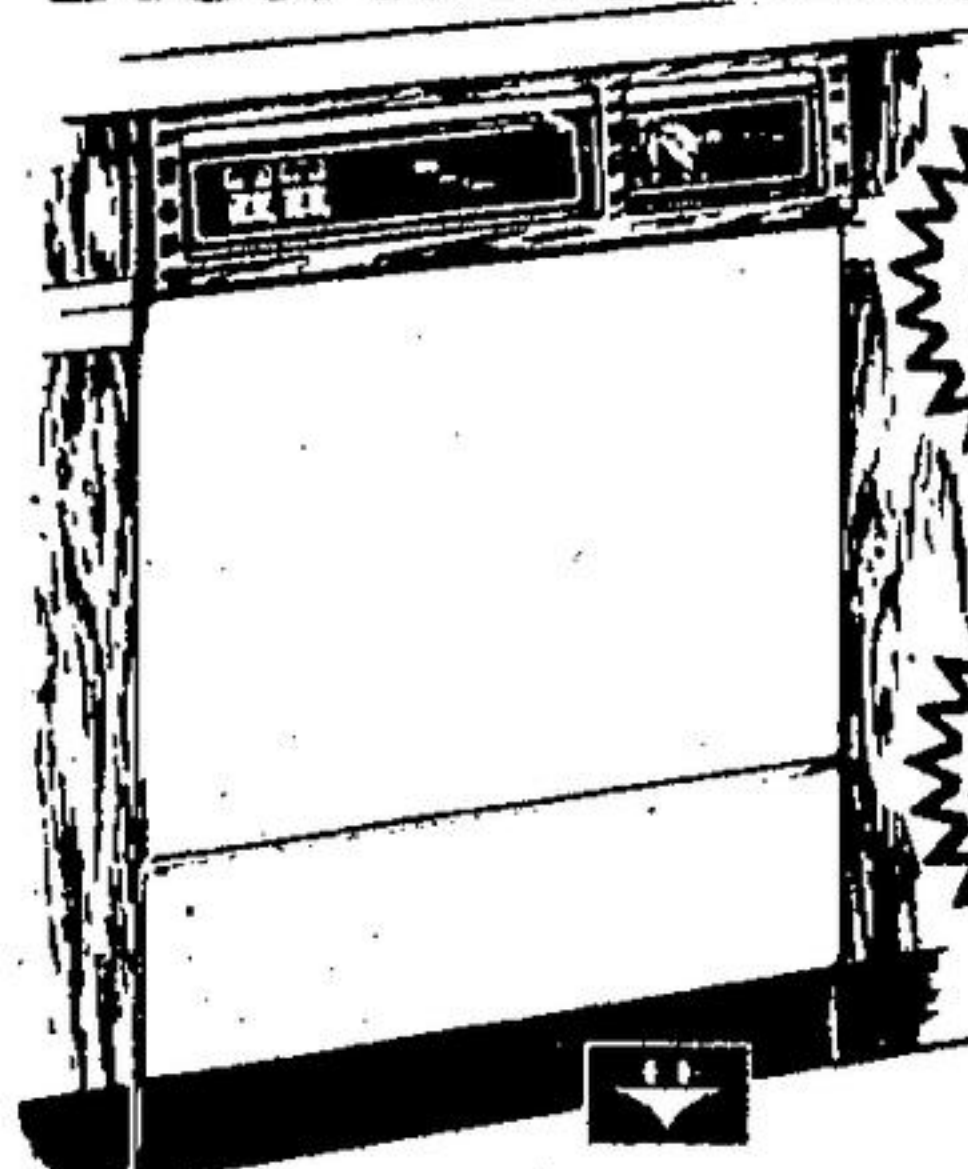
