Council made appointments to a number of committees recently.

Couns. Marilyn Serjeantson and Gerald Rennie were appointed to the ActVan Advisory Committee.

Coun. Rick Bonnette and Mayor Russ Miller were appointed to the Acton Urban Boundary Implementation Study Committee.

Coun. Rennie was appointed to the Acton Business Improvement Area while Couns. John McDonald and Pam Johnston were appointed to the Georgetown Business Improvement Area. These appointments are for three years.

Coun. Bowman was appointed for a two-year term with the North Halton Social Planning Council.

appointed to the Honor and Recognition Awards Committee: Couns. Bonnette, Sheldon, Fisher and Serjeantson.

Appointed to the Citizens Appointments Interviewing Committee were: Couns. Norton, Rennie, Johnston and Cook.

Coun. McDonald and Mayor Russ Miller will be sitting on the Liaison Committee with the Highland Games Association.

Seven councillors are sitting on the Municipally Owned Property Committee: Couns. Sheldon, Bowman, Fisher, Elliott, Cook, Bonnette and Mayor Miller.
