Two period defeat tough to take

Rebels lose in overtime

The Georgetown District High School senior boys basketball team endured its most painful loss of the current East Hallow season Thursday.

The Rebels dropped 49-46 double-overtime loss to Queen Elizabeth Park Eagles at the Georgetown gym. What made the loss especially hard to take was the home team had two opportunities to win the game with bonus free throw situations. However, Georgetown couldn't connect on either, and with one second left to play Q.E. Park's Randy Nicholson sank one of his two bonus free throws to tie the game 41-41 and send it into overtime.

"This was our best game, but it's the toughest loss," said Rebels' coach Bevin Clark after. "Someone had to win and someone had to lose, but I wish it was the other way around."

In both overtime periods Georgetown controlled the opening tip and had the first scoring chances, but couldn't capitalize. In the first period with the score tied 43-43 Georgetown again had a chance to win when with just 18 seconds remaining a Rebel went to the free throw line with one and the bonus. However, Georgetown wasn't able to come up with the winning hoop.

A big call in the second overtime period went against the Rebels. With the Eagles leading 45-43 Georgetown's Jeff Janssen was called for a blocking foul which sent Q.E. Park to the foul line. There they made one of the two bonus shots to take a 46-43 lead and never looked back.

"It was a tough call," Clark said. "If he calls it for us we get the ball back and win the game. If he calls it for them they go to the line. It was a tough game to call because it was so tight, and I'm not blaming the official."

However, Clark was disappointed his club couldn't convert the chances it had to win the game from the foul line.

"At practice last week we had a special 20 minute free throw session to loosen things up," Clark said. "But that's where we lost it."

The loss, coupled with Tuesday's 70-66 loss to T.A. Blakelock, gives Georgetown a record of one win against six losses. That mark is

receiving the Rebels' coach sala. "We're 1-6 and we've been out of only one ball game," Clark said. "With any breaks at all we could easily be 6-1."

"It was a hard loss to take (Thursday) but I don't think the guys are down," Clark said.

Louis DePaoli had 11 points Thurs-

day for Georgetown while Janssen chipped in with nine. Glen McCaughtry had eight while Casey Vandersius had six. Tuesday DePaoli had 16 points while McCaughtry had 12. Janssen chipped in with eight.

The Rebels won't play again until Jan. 8 when they take on Milton.

Midgets have win streak halted at four by Eagles

The Georgetown District High School midget boys basketball team had its four-game winning streak halted at four Thursday afternoon.

The previously undefeated Rebels dropped a 32-30 squeaker to Queen Elizabeth Park Eagles at the Georgetown gym. The contest was a match of two unbeaten clubs.

Georgetown came out strong and jumped out to a 14-8 first quarter lead, then led 23-18 at the half. However the Eagles took a 26-25 advantage heading into the final quarter.

The fourth period was a see-saw affair, but with just 41 seconds left Georgetown had a narrow two-point lead. The Eagles tied it up, and with only eight seconds left netted the winning hoop after Georgetown turned the ball over on an over and back violation with just 12 seconds remaining. The Rebels weren't able to get the ball upcourt fast enough for a last-second attempt to win the game.

In the entire second half the Rebels were able to manage but seven points. On the other hand the Eagles led 14.

"Our first half was our typical style," said Rebels coach Moe Leeking. "In the second half we really clammed up when the pressure was on, but the kids were trying their hardest and you're going to get that at the midget level."

"In the second half we hit a cold streak and pressed. But I told the kids not to feel bad, we can learn from that," he added.

Mark Murnaghan led the way offensively for the Rebels with 18 points, 16 of which came in the first

half. Andreas Schirm had eight.

Tuesday the team travelled to Oakville to take on the T.A. Blakelock squad and came away with a 67-23 win. Schirm had 18 points for the winners.

The Rebels' next contest will be Jan. 8 when their opponent will be Milton High School.

Taller Eagles win over junior Rebels

A superiority in height paid off in a big way for the Queen Elizabeth Park Eagles Thursday, much to the dismay of the Georgetown District High School junior Rebels.

The Eagles were able to control the offensive and defensive boards and thus overcome an early first quarter deficit to record a 55-38 win. The loss was the first for the Georgetown team as the game was played on the Rebels' home court.

Georgetown led 12-2 late in the first quarter, and had a 14-6 advantage after one quarter of play. However, the Eagles came back to tie the contest 23-23 at the half, then take control en route to the win.

"We played well and moved the ball real good," said Rebels' coach Rick Redshaw. "Our shooting wasn't pinpoint and we lost it on the boards."

Redshaw's troops employed a man defence in the first quarter, but the Rebels' coach switched to a zone in the second half. He said the move was made as some of his starters were tiring, but he questioned later the move.

"Maybe I took the man off too early," he said. "When we got into the zone the boys seemed to sit back a bit."

The Rebels received a big blow when John Watts had to leave Thursday's game after the first half as he had an appointment elsewhere. Watts did a good job handling the ball and had 10 points after two quarters.

Both Watts and Dave Harris had 10 points for Georgetown while Mike Hurley had seven points.

Tuesday the Rebels travelled to T.A. Blakelock and left with 49-29 win after leading 28-18 at the end of the first half. Playing a team of equal size, Redshaw said his squad was able to control the rebounds and let a poor outside shooting Blakelock team keep trying to find their mark from the perimeter.

"Tuesday the kids weren't missing the easy shots," Redshaw said.

In that game Tuesday Watts had 13 points while Mike Hurley added eight.

The Rebels' next games are Jan. 8 against Milton and at home Jan. 10 against Oakville-Trafalgar at the Georgetown gym.
