Coun. Grieve currently sits on the board and Coun. Oliver sat on it three years ago. Their new appointments run til Nov. 30, 1988.

Also in the running were Milton Mayor Gord Krants, and Coun. Bill Johnston and Oakville Mayor Bill Perras.

In his nomination speech before the secret ballot vote, Coun. Oliver pointed out his considerable experience and knowledge of police force and commission operations.

"I'm concerned about the citizens, their safety, the administration and the costs of operating a police force," Coun. Oliver said.

Coun. Grieve said he wanted to carry on with the work begun in the past three years by the Commission, and told councillors two political appointments will have to be made by the province this year to replace retiring Commissioners Judge Joseph Scime of Burlington and Rick Morrow of Georgetown.

There are five seats on the Commission; three are provincially appointed and two are appointed by Halton Region.

"I want to be returned for reasons of continuity," Coun. Grieve said in his nomination speech. "There are programs ongoing which require continuing interest and control."

He pointed out the Commission had embarked on a three year plan of budgeting last year instead of the one-year look at the budget which has found too narrow for long-range planning. Coun. Grieve said he wanted to see that kind of planning carried on.

As for wages, the councillors said the arbitration process can be. improved.

"Arbitrators, in my view, should be looking inside the bodies paying the wages. They aren't now," Coun. Grieve said, indicating he hopes to be talking with the Solicitor General's department about that.

Halton's police are among the most innovative and cost effective and the staff morale is considered to be one of the highest, he said.

Asplring commissioner Coun. Johnston of Milton pointed out it had been five years that Milton had not had any representation on the Commission.

Oakville Coun. John Graham was disappointed with the nominations and the appointments in that no women were nominated to be police commissioners. The Halton Region Police Commission has never had any female on it.

"I certainly support the two names going forward, but something is out of order when the Police Commission continues to operate with five men and no women." Coun. Graham objected.

He pointed out the two most common incidents requiring police assistance are traffic addients and family violence or disputes.

Coun. Graham said he'd broached the sublect privately with is MPP, asking his support for the appointment of women to the Commiss-


