Happy New Year one and all from the Georgetown Track Club! Two weeks ago the Club, in association with the Credit Valley Conservation Authority sponsored the Terra Cotta Egg Nog Jog. It was a cold and blustery day but 146 brave souls came to enjoy the wintery countryside and sip some egg nog.

The 11-km route was covered in a time of 38:49 by winner Kevin Powers. Don Melnik (39:21) and Hamish Dougherty (39:45) were second and third respectively. The Georgetown Track Club's best three placed fourth, fifth and eighth overall. Sean Cleary had a time of 41:26, John Grace finished in 42:14 and Alex Campbell crossed the line in 42:41. The eventual women's winner was Victoria Seay, who finished in 45:22 and placed 24th overall.

This event seems to be growing each year and is enjoyed by all runners. There are no other events at this time of year and we expect to see many more next year.

On Jan. 12 the Club will participate in the Peterborough Snow Fest Marathon. We're entering the Mega Team event which involves 20 runners per team. Twenty must finish and eight must be over 40 and four must be women. This is always an exciting event, and we're taking runners who will participate in the 10km event at the same time also.

'86 midget tourney offers a nice mix

The 20th annual Georgetown Minor Hockey Association midget hockey tournament will feature a nice mix of teams from all parts of Ontario. Tournament director Fred Hammer said the 16 teams taking part in the six-day event come from all parts of southern Ontario. Hammer said that was a goal he had when starting out organizing the tournament.

"It took a lot of calls to get the 16 teams," Hammer said. "We've got a good cross section (in terms of representation)." Teams from Orillia, Whitby, Brooklin, Richmond Hill, Stratford, Niagara Falls, Newmarket, Toronto, Dundas, Etobico, Ajax, Waterloo, Grimsby, London, Owen Sound, Port Perry as well as Georgetown's Sunny Acres major midgets will form the list

of competitors. The tournament begins Jan. 7 (Tuesday) when Georgetown and Brooklin-Whitby tangle at 6:30 p.m. at the Alcott Arena.

All games will be played at the Alcott Arena, with the consolation final going Sunday Jan. 12 at 2:45 p.m. The championship game will follow at 5 p.m. Admission will be \$2 for adults and 75 cents for seniors and children. Week passes are available for \$8. Hammer said the field is such that any one of the teams could walk away with the tournament championship. "Stratford and Newmarket are usually strong, and Owen Sound has been strong in the past," he said. "I expect Orillia and London to be strong also."

Hammer also said he expects Georgetown's entry to be formidable. "In the past Georgetown has been able to hold their own in the tournament," Hammer said. "As far as I can see for "AA" tournaments this is The Tournament," Hammer added. "It is probably the largest (in Ontario) and keeping the "AAA" centres away gives fairly even competition."

"Looking at all the teams it will probably be a super tournament," he added.

One aim Hammer had this year was to cut the number of Tri-County entries in half from four last year to two this year. He said hockey fans see the Tri-County centres all season long, and getting outside communities involved increases fan interest.

"I'm pleased with the teams we managed to get. It should make for an interesting tournament and there should be some good hockey played," Hammer added.

As well, scouts from the Major Junior and Tier II circuits are expected to attend. Also Central Scouting will be on hand.

Shorthanded locals overwhelm Flamboro

A shorthanded Hanman Electric "AA" Major Peewee squad travelled to Carlisle Arena last Sunday to deliver Seasons Greetings to the host club Flamboro, played a game lasting almost two hours and came home with a well earned victory. Trent Cull, a Minor Peewee defenceman, lending strength to the team for the day, played a strong game for the Majors.

Flamboro hit the ice chanting "Easy" but were soon left with their heads hanging although scoring the first marker on a deflection early in the first frame. Mark Mininch caught the blue and gold defence out of position to send "Chip" McEwen and Andy Pearce in for a 2 on 0 crack at the goalie. McEwen made no mistake on his pass at the hashmarks to Pearce and a wristshot evened the count 1-1. Trent Cull fed the puck into Flamboro territory and hard work in the corner on the boards by Dave Watts paid off as he got the puck out front to Bill McDonald who lifted the rebounding rubber over the netminder for a 2-1 lead.

Flamboro retaliated to tie the game taking advantage of two Georgetown penalties. Pearce notched the go-ahead tally, his second of the game, on a pass from Rod Pasma, and again Mininch caught the defence sleeping to set up another 2 on 0 break. With 3:53 left in the second frame, Pasma fed the rubber into Pearce along the boards, who out-manoeuvred a lone defenceman and passed to a wide open Jim English who was dead accurate on his shot from the low slot to give the locals a 4-2 edge.

The last period was all Georgetown as Flamboro seemed to forget the puck and played the man, allowing the Hanman Club to light up the scoreboard like a "Christmas Tree" with

five more goals. Wade Serjeantson beat the blue and gold on the open side of the net for goal number 5 as Mike Melville's stick handling and perfectly timed pass went through two challenging defencemen. Pasma also assisted on this shorthanded marker. Flamboro again capitalized on a power play and counted their third and last marker for a 5-3 score. Georgetown revved up the "Black Machine" and never looked back.

At the 5:44 mark the Flamboro goalie couldn't hold onto the "bullet" fired by Pearce from the centre ice area, giving him a hat trick. Less than a minute later Dave Watts slid home a rebound shot in the corner from McDonald and Pasma. 25 seconds later, while backchecking, Pearce turned on the jets, stole the puck and again broke in alone to score his fourth goal with a nice deke and a shot low on the stick side to make it 8-3. All this excitement was not enough as Georgetown was awarded a penalty shot with 2:22 remaining in the game, and Rod Pasma put the "star on top of the tree" as his wrist shot beat the Flamboro goalie between the pads. The entire Hanman team deserves credit for this win displaying a "Lot of Class in keeping their cool" as 56 penalty minutes were assessed to both clubs in all.

These Peewees are off to Richmond Hill over Christmas break to participate in this nationally known tourney.
