'86 midget tourney offers a nice mix

The 20th annual Georgetown Minor Hockey Association midget hockey tournament will feature a nice mix of teams from all parts of Ontario.

Tournament director Fred Hammer said the 16 teams taking part in the six-day event come from all parts of southern Ontario. Hammer said that was a goal he had when starting out organizing the tourna-

"It took a lot of calls to get the 16 teams," Hammer said. "We've got a good cross section (in terms of representation)."

Teams from Orillia, Whitby-Brooklin, Richmond Hill, Stratford, Niagara Falls, Newmarket, Toronto. Dundas, Etobico, Ajax, Waterloo, Grimsby, London, Owen Sound, Port Perry as well as Georgetown's Sunny Acres major midgets will form the list

of competitors. The tournament begins Jan. 7 (Tuesday) when Georgetown and Brooklin-Whitby tangle at 6:30 p.m. at the Alcott Arena.

All games will be played at the Alcott Arena, with the consolation final going Sunday Jan. 12 at 2:45 p.m. The championship game will follow at 5 p.m.

Admission will be \$2 for adults and 75 cents for seniors and children. Week passes are available for \$8.

Hammer said the field is such that any one of the teams could walk away with the tournament championship.

"Stratford and Newmarket are usually strong, and Owen Sound has been strong in the past," he said. "I expect Orillia and London to be strong

Hammer also said he expects Georgetown's entry to be formidable. 'In the past Georgetown has been able to hold their own in the tourna-

ment," Hammer said. "As far as I can see for "AA" tournaments this is The Tournament," Hammer added. "It is probably the largest (in Ontario) and keeping the "AAA" centres away gives fairly even competition.

"Looking at all the teams it will probably be a super tournament," he

One aim Hammer had this year was to cut the number of Tri-County entries in half from four last year to two this year. He said hockey fans see the Tri-County centres all season long, and getting outside communities involved increases fan interest,

"I'm pleased with the teams we managed to get. It should make for an interesting tournament and there should be some good hockey played," Hammer added.

As well, scouts from the Major Junior and Tier II circuits are expected to attend. Also Central Scouting will be on hand.


