MPP race

Pomeroy doubles spending of eventual winner Knight

Spending more than twice as much on his campaign didn't help Progressive Conservative candidate Peter Pomeroy win the last provincial election in Halton-Burlington.

The recently released statements of campaign receipts and expenses for the candidates in the May 2, 1985 election show Mr. Pomeroy spent \$65,655 on his campaign.

His chief opponent, Liberal Don Knight spent \$29,763, while NDP candidate Doug Hamilton spent

\$11,293. Mr. Knight won the MPP seat. If fund-raising were an indication of support, Mr. Pomeroy should have won the election. His forces were able to raise \$56,729 towards his campaign, leaving him short only by about \$9,000. This amount qualifies for a subsidy from the Electoral Commission.

Campaign advertising cost Mr. Pomeroy \$11,337 in the May election. For Mr. Knight, advertising cost \$9,010, and for Mr. Hamilton, \$740.

Mr. Knight's \$29,763 campaign raised \$15,790, but he also is eligible for a \$8,926 Electoral Commission subsidy based on the number of votes he got. He was left with a \$5,046 deficit.

Mr. Hamilton was the one candidate in the riding to come out in the black. His election campaign managed to rustle up \$11,670, putting him a couple of hundred dollars in the clear.

Contributions towards the NDP campaign were nearly \$6,000, and the candidate received another \$5,320 from his party. The Liberal party gave its candidate \$1,400, while the Progressive Conservative party gave \$37,586 to its nominee.

Dog sled races

The excitement of the North comes south again this winter when sled dog races return to Cold Creek Conservation Area near Bolton.

The races will be held the weekends of Jan. 4, 5, 11, 12, 25 and 26, from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day, weather permitting. Three and five-dog teams will be competing in a series of time trials. The trials are sponsored by the Southern Ontario Area of the Siberian Husky Club of Canada. This is one of the few opportunities for people in the Metro Toronto region to experience first-hand the thrills of competitive sled dog racing.

Visitors are welcome to talk to the competitors and ask questions about racing and dog breeding. Cold Creek Conservation Area is located midway between Bolton and Nobleton, on Concession Road 11, north of the King Sideroad. Freedom's not just another word says Toronto cab driver

People are proud to be Canadian citizens and they like our Charter of Rights and Freedoms, says Toronto cab driver Don Moore. He was on Main Street in Georgetown Monday handing out our Charter to curious pedestrians. "It's (the Charter) their rights and in my opinion, they want to show it (off)," says Mr. Moore, a part-time public relations man for the Church of Scientology.

For over a year now, he has been travelling to over 27 communities, handing out the Charter of Rights and Freedoms.

He says the response has been tremendous and he figures he's distributed about 42,000 copies to people in Ontario.

What started Mr. Moore on his travels were the results of a survey the Church of Scientology commissioned.

The survey revealed that many people lacked interest in the Canadian Charter and were unaware of the contents of the document.

"Part of our creed is to make people's rights known to them," he says.

The federal government provided the copies of the Charter free and Mr. Moore hands them out with an inscription at the bottom of the Charter which says, "compliments of the Church of Scientology of Toronto."

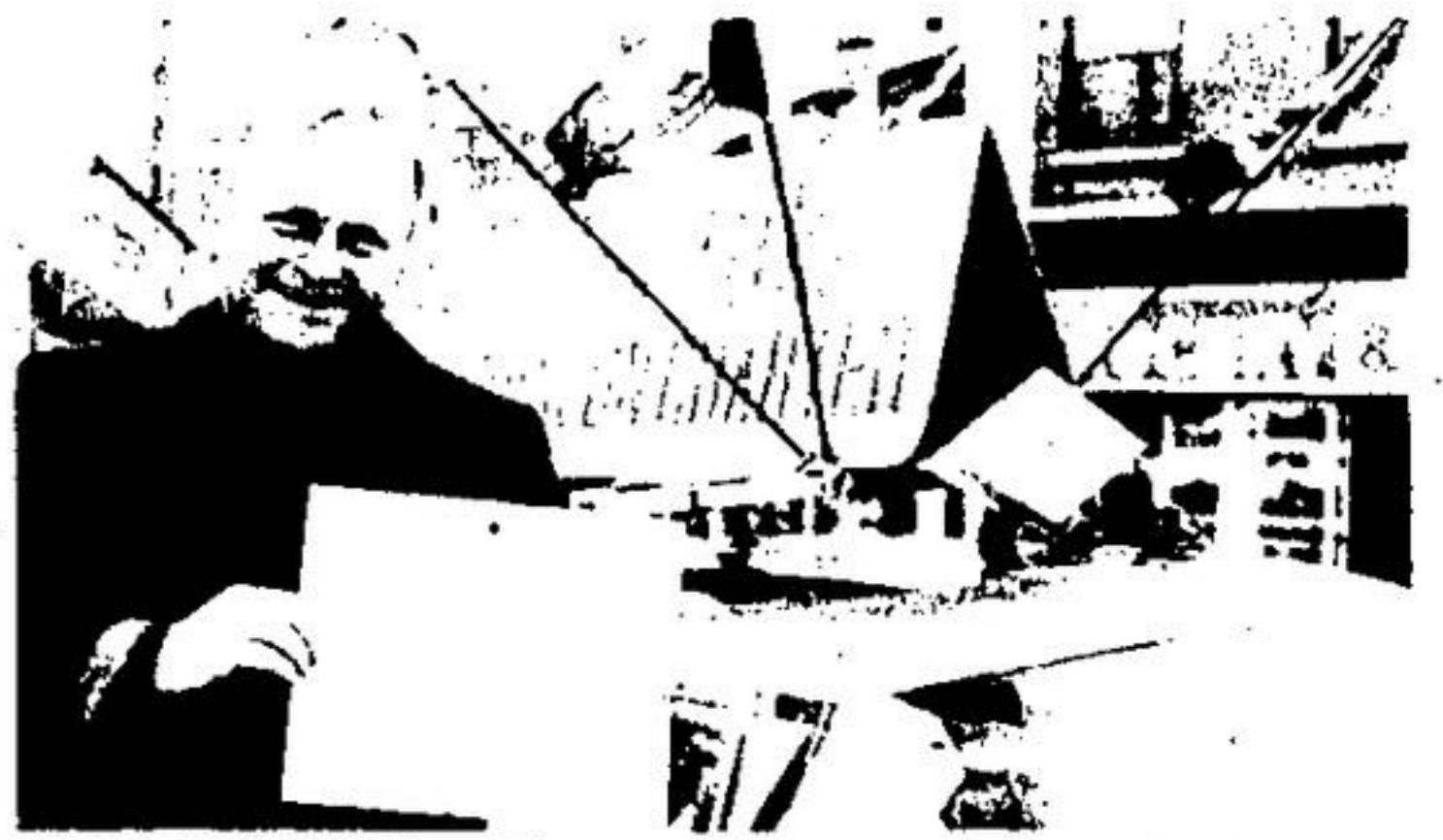
"We decided to take it to the street because we think it's (the Charter) important and that's the most effective way to do it," he says. "Once they see

me set up here, they get interested."

Mr. Moore believes Canadians have a good Charter, but the government aren't doing a proper job of promoting it to the people.

The campaign isn't a recruitment drive for the Church of Scientology, Mr. Moore says. If people want to know more about his organization he will talk to them and has literature available, he says.

Mr. Moore travels to a different Ontario community usually one day per week, and spends the day handing out copies of the Charter. The campaign may eventually be expanded to other parts of Canada, he says. The Church of Scientology was founded in 1950 in Washington, D.C. There are six million members world-wide, says Mr. Moore.
