AN EDUCATION? "Why do we go to school? Benjamin Franklin once said, "If a man empties his purse into his head, no man can take it away from him; an investment in knowledge alway pays the best interest."

We are faced with the fact that the competition which exists in the business world is ten times greater than it was twenty years ago. What will it be twenty years from now -when your boy reaches manhood?

Will he step out into the business world well fortified with an education and a trained mind to win the struggle of life, or must be start at a fearful disadvantage because of an inadequate education - a crushing handicap which he may never be able to overcome.

Concern for Park pupils may result in crossing

A school crossing area, with white lines and appropriate signs has been recommended by Halton Regional Police for Charles and Mill Streets in Georgetown

If a reassessment of the crossing in October finds students using it to go to Park Public School have increased, it will be considered for a crossing guard

Councillors are expected to en dorse the police report at their meeting Tuesday, March 11

According to Const. Bill Phipps, in a study Jan. 29, about 60 youngsters crossed at this location on their way to and from school that morning. He notes there is no sidewalk on the east side of Charles Street between Church Street and Remembrance Park.

"How effective is a crossing without a crossing guard, since we're talking about safety?" Coun. Gerald Rennie demanded Monday right in general committee meeting

Town Engineer Bob Austin replied that drivers tend to be more careful when they see school crossing signs.

Police did a pedestrian and vehicle count in their report and also took note of vehicle speed in the area Coun. Lillias Bowman wanted to know who will decide when there are enough children to warrant hir-

ing a crossing guard at the intersec-

will monitor the intersection and when he feels it to be necessary will recommend a crossing guard.

monitored, especially in the winter time when the snow is bad and the children walk on the road," Coun-Betty Fisher said



Plan for boutiques, hotel


A public meeting is expected to be held shortly on an application to amend zoning on the Instoric Barber

Mill property in Georgetown. Deputy Planning Director Bruce McLean has recommended a public meeting be held and a formal ratification of his recommendation is expected at Tuesday night's council meeting

Anne and Robert Kreutzer want Georgetown's zoning bylaw for part of Lots 18 and 19, Con. 10 amended to allow redevelopment of the Barber Mill site south of River Drive

The couple want to develop the site by the Credit River into a multipurpose complex which would include uses as convention and banquet facilities, hotel rooms, commercial boutiques, dining and lounge areas and associated recreational and staff facilities.

They want to rehabilitate and expand the existing buildings which are about 74,500 square feet to house a commercial complex with boutiques (about 2,750 square feet); 66

The town's planning report indicates these areas are to be located within the two existing structures on the property with further developments to be phased in, in three stages

Designated industrial for the most part in the town's 1982 Official Plan, the mill property also has areas designated "Major Open Space", "Rural", and "Residential".
