**BLONDE BROWNIES**  
• 2½ cups sifted all-purpose flour  
• 2½ tsp. double acting baking powder  
• ½ tsp. salt  
• ½ cup butter or margarine  
• 2¼ cups brown sugar, packed  
• 3 eggs  
• 1 cup chopped nuts  
• 6 oz. Butterscotch or chocolate chips  
Heat oven to 350°. Grease 15½" by 10½" by 1" pan. Sift together flour, baking powder, salt. In large saucepan, melt butter; stir in brown sugar; cool 10 minutes. Then add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Stir in flour mixture, nuts, butterscotch pieces until well blended. Spread in pan. Bake 25 to 30 minutes, or until centre springs back when lightly touched. Cool; cut into 2" squares. Store in airtight container.
