Renovations planned for field

The football field located behind Georgetown District High School will receive a major facelift this spring.

The field will be renovated soon with the costs being split between the Halton Board of Education and the Town of Halton Hills Recreation and Parks Department. After the renovations are made, the Town will regularly maintain the field during the summer.

The exact work to be done isn't known yet. Recreation and Parks crews will first examine the field then determine the extent of the work required. Last fall the Town put sand and top soil on the field prior to high school football and field hockey starting. That was done in

order to level the field out some and fill in some of the holes that were present.

The renovating of the field will mean all school activities on-school and extra-curriculum will be ceased on the football field. That means alternative sites for boys rugby and girls soccer.

The soccer team will play on the Wigglesworth field located near the football field. Meanwhile the rugby squad will toil at Emmerson field, or play all their games on the road this season.

After the renovations are done, the Department will run some of their programs at the high school during the summer. However, the field will be regularly maintained and in good shape for school activities in the fall.
