Junior "B" Gemini select senior VPs

Now ~~Jack~~ **Jack Handy** has been named vice-president of Hockey Operations for Georgetown Gemini. He expects to name a coach and general manager for the team by the end of May.

Handy's selection as VP of hockey operations came last week at the Central Ontario Junior "B" Hockey League team's executive meeting. The meeting was the first for the newly elected body, which was selected two weeks ago.

Not only does Handy want to know who the coach and GM are by the end of May, but he wants those people working in the hockey operations department to know and fully understand their duties. However, the first item on Handy's agenda will be the selection of a coach and general manager for the team.

The people selected for both jobs this season won't likely be the same ones who performed the duties for last year's Gemini club. Both coach Jules Rusciani and general manager Bob Webster have said they won't be back in their old jobs with the hockey club this coming season.

"We will try to select someone who's qualified for the system we're trying to set up," Handy said. "If we can get into the position in two or three years where players wanting to play Jr. B hockey say they want to play in Georgetown, that will be an accomplishment."

Handy said the team will advertise for both positions. He also said if the right person comes along the applicant might assume both the coach and general manager titles.

However, that doesn't mean the person will be fully responsible to perform both jobs.

"Even if we have one person with both titles we will still have assistants who will do some duties," Handy said. "We don't want any one person bogged down."

Team president Dave Kentner is pleased to have Handy as his VP of hockey operations.

Jack Handy is obviously a veteran hockey executive member in Georgetown. One of the greatest attributes Jack brings is he's willing to listen to everyone's point of view and makes his decisions by consensus rather than by an arbitrary decision," Kentner said.

Other senior vice presidents named at the meeting were Sue Evans (VP of Administration), Dave Baranger and Jack Barnes (both VPs of Finance). The lone position that wasn't filled was the VP of the Booster Club.

Badminton duo surprises

NEW LISKEARD—The mixed doubles badminton team of Chris Harris and Lloyd Newman surprised their coaches this weekend with their play at the Ontario Federation of Schools Athletic Association (OFSAA) tournament held here.

The Georgetown District High School duo finished seventh overall in the 36-team competition, and were very nearly fifth overall in their last match of the tournament the Georgetown team lost to a Lastowel

pair 17-14, 15-11. A win there would have given the local team the fifth place finish.

Rebels coaches Bob McKay and Mavis O'Neill were both surprised with the play of Harris and Newman. The coaches' goal at the tournament was to see their team come away with a win, but the Georgetown squad ended up winning four of their six matches.

"This was something we didn't anticipate at all," McKay said. "They

really performed beyond our expectations."

McKay said in the team's final game of the tourney the play of Lastowel's Gord McCallum was the key to that squad's win. McCallum was able to shield his female partner who wasn't on an even keel with Georgetown's Harris.

"The guy was like a cat on the court," McKay said. "He forced us into making shots we didn't want to make. When we did get it to the girl,

it was no contest."

Harris and Newman started the tournament on a bad note, dropping their first match to a team that featured a left-handed male player. McKay chalked the loss up to both nerves and facing a left-handed player.

In their second match the Georgetown duo dropped the first game 15-3 before rallying back for a second game win and eventual match victory. From that point the Rebels won three straight games and qualified for the tournament quarterfinals before losing to the Lastowel team.

What made the Georgetown accomplishment even more significant is that of the 36 teams in the tournament just three (including the Georgetown team) were not club competitors.

"It would have been a feather in our cap to pull it off (fifth place overall) but the kids performed well beyond our expectations. It just shows that high school trained players can do well," McKay said.

"The competition was really deserving. The top four seeds deserved to be seeded one through four," McKay added. "To get to the elite level you have to play in all the tournaments."

"To the club kids this was just another tournament. They all knew one another. There was no pressure on us and that's how the kids played," McKay added.
