# Glen residents concerned with development plan for 43 homes

Glen Williams residents packed the council chambers Monday night to voice their concerns about a development planned for their com-

Meagan Developments Ltd., owned by Georgetown's Ab Tennant, wants to put up 43 single family homes with piped municipal water and private septic disposal systems north of Cindy Place. That's at Part Lot 21, Con. 9, east of Eighth Line and the abandoned CNR line, and north of Wildwood Road. A public meeting about the proposal lasted two hours.

Homes in Meagan Meadows are to be built in two phases, with the first
phase being 21 homes and the second, 22 homes. Each residential lot. would be about one and a half acres minimum in size.

Three studies have already been done: a storm water management study, a traffic impact study and a hydrogeological study. All were done by Clipsham Consulting : Engineers Ltd.

Tweedle Street resident John Minns questioned whether there would be adequate water pressure to supply these homes without a pumping station.

Bob Clipsham said a loop con-nected from Wildwood to Erin Street creates the water pressure required. If Glen residents want to hook onto the water main that will travel along Wildwood Road, they will be able to, at their expense.


Lawyer Bert Arnold said that if the water supply of any area residents is interrupted because of the water main construction, the region is responsible for providing these residents with water, at the region's expense.

Frontage on these homes varies from a minimum of 59 to 179 feet. Wildwood Road resident Tut Harrison said he has no objection to the development.

"I think we should have it. I welcome it as an asset to our municipality, but it should not be a burden to us taxpayers," Mr. Harrison said.




