

POLICE BEAT

Major injuries

Eileen McNally, 75, of 70 Irwin Cres. in Georgetown is in satisfactory condition at Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital after suffering major injuries in an automobile accident June 2.

The accident occurred in Glen Williams. The driver of a Mazda was west on Credit Street and failed to yield at the intersection with Beaver Street, police said.

The Mazda was hit by a 1961 Ford pulling a trailer. The Ford was travelling about 35 kilometres per hour north on Beaver Street. The speed of the Mazda was unknown.

Cyclist hurt

A cut finger was all a 14-year-old suffered after running into the rear of a parked car June 3 at 1 p.m., police said. He caused \$100 damage to his CCM bicycle and \$700 damage to the parked 1983 Oldsmobile. The Raylawn Crescent resident was southbound on his street, turned his head to look up the street and ran into the car, police said.

No arson

Arson was ruled out as the cause of a fire at 18 Sherman Ct. June 1. The fire caused \$50,000 damage to a home. It started in the garage. Investigators concluded the fire was started by a barbecue. Nobody was harmed in the blaze.

Fawn killed

A fawn was the victim of a car accident on the Guelph Line at Sideroad 25 June 5 at 12:05 p.m. The fawn wandered onto the Guelph Line with its mother and was hit by a Guelph man driving his car northbound between 70 and 80 kilometres per hour. Damage to the car was \$2,500. The mother deer was not reported hurt.

Four injured

An Acton man, his three passengers from Moffatt and a Campbellville man were injured in an automobile accident on the Second Line at Steeles Avenue June 2.

Jeffrey Herrington, 23, of Storey Drive in Acton received minimal injuries; Claudette Beaudoin, 19, of Moffatt received minor injuries; Beverly Beaudoin, 39, of Moffatt received minor injuries, and Kathy Beaudoin, 7, of Moffatt received minimal injuries. The only passenger in the other car was a Campbellville man who suffered minimal injuries. Total damage to the two cars was \$7,000.

A hill contributed to the cause of the accident, police said. The driver of a 1982 Buick was coming southbound over a hill on the Second Line when he hit a 1979 Chevrolet turning into a driveway, police said.

House burglar

Olympic coins and pearls worth a total of \$700 were taken from a Bard Lane home in Georgetown between June 5 and 6. Entry was gained through the front living room window, police said.

Gas station theft

An adding machine and \$1,300 in cigarettes were taken from the Ashgrove Petro-Canada station over the night of June 4. Thieves entered by breaking a window. Damage was estimated at \$50.

Cigarette thieves

Police are looking for the man who witnessed the theft of \$8,000 in cigarettes from the A and P store at 100 Sinclair Ave. in Georgetown. Thieves used the garbage chute of the store to steal the cigarettes June 2 between 10 and 11 p.m.

The man who witnessed the theft reported it to the manager of A and P too late for police to take action, Detective Keith Woodstra said. The witness left the scene and did not give his name.

Two men were seen loading boxes of cigarettes into a car at the rear of A and P. The thieves entered the storage room of the store during operating hours and used a garbage chute to get the cigarettes out of the store, Detective Woodstra said.

Seven A and P stores in the Toronto area have been robbed of cigarettes in similar ways since January. Police suspect the robberies are connected, Detective Woodstra said.

Two Georgetown youths suffered minimal injuries when the driver of the car they were in went off the road. The accident occurred June 4 where the Sixth Line meets Sideroad 5. Clint Cardinell, 14, of Park Avenue and Darren McCullum, 16, of Rexway Drive, suffered minimal injuries.

Hijacker foiled

A hitchhiker trying to rob an Acton man received a surprise when the driver resisted him and "kicked him" out of the car, police said. The Acton man picked up the passenger in Toronto and kicked him out on Trafalgar Road in Ashgrove June 7 at 12 p.m.

The conflict began on Trafalgar Road when the passenger threatened the driver. He said he had a knife and wanted the car. No knife was seen. The 37-year-old Acton man stopped the car, "struck him and kicked him out of the car", police said.

Then the Acton man drove to Acton where he called the police. The culprit was not found. He was described as a 25-year-old male with blond hair, blue jeans, a light tan leather jacket and dark blue T-shirt. He was 5 feet 7 inches tall and weighed about 185 lbs., police said.

Minor injuries

Kenneth Ford, 20, received minor injuries June 5 in an accident on Mountainview Road North. The Glen Williams resident from 141 Confederation Street was taken to Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital where he was treated and released. A 1978 Honda was northbound on Mountainview Road North when the driver hit a 1974 Plymouth. After hitting the car the driver went over a curb and ran into a mailbox, police said. Damage to the Honda was \$400 and damage to the Plymouth was \$300.
