The Clinic is staffed by two lawyers (David Craig, Director of the Clinic, and Jack Fleming, Staff Lawyer), one community legal worker (Karen Thompson-Harry)

Separate School in Acton. The visit was the last in a series from about 20 professionals who explained their careers. The mayor, a doctor, a businessman and a funeral director were among those who dropped in during the last three months of school.

In addition to being a principal, Livingstone is a musician and composer. He plays his compositions in

Toronto area night clubs and beyond.

Using the example of what is involved to put on a concert tour, Mr. Livingstone showed the students how many jobs are involved in the Advertising, booking, novelties, media, musicians and more were mentioned.

His ultimate message was 'You can make a living in whatever you want to do." The important thing is to work hard. In picking a career, Mr. Livingstone suggested students

should be comfortable with their choice, so they will be able to put more of themselves into their work.

Be prepared to switch your career, he said. A student at the School of Performing Arts started out wanting to be a performer. She changed her goal and is now striving to become a musical therapist (someone who helps people through music). The career you pick should be your choice; "You must live for yourself," he said.
