## 'Friends' plan for Bateman exhibit

An important exhibition of art will highlight the year for the Friends of the Halton Hills Libraries. At their annual general meeting June 16, details were discussed for this summer's exhibition in Georgetown of work by Ken Danby, one of Canada's leading artists.

The exhibition will hang in the cultural centre gallery July 16 to August 30 with an opportunity for local residents to meet the artist who will attend the opening night gala July 16.

Funds raised by The Friends are used to help the two local libraries with their various requirements. Last year the group purchased extra copies of best-selling books for the library collections in Acton and Georgetown and provided the picture railing that was required to hang the libraries' permanent art collection at the Georgetown facility.

At the annual meeting, it was decided to purchase a portable display case for use in either Acton or Georgetown and two smaller display units to house the library's Eskimo sculptures.

The election of officers for 1986-87 was concluded with Doug Magwood being returned as Chairman. The Board of Directors includes Joan Lister, Bettyanne Weststead, Joan Smith, John Sommer and Azolyn Fisher, representing the Library Board.

Since the group was founded in 1964 the Friends has sponsored the successful Robert Bateman retrospective, a concert featuring the Peter Appleyard quartet, and two Christmas artwork lotteries.

Plans were also discussed for a reception to open Public Libraries Week in October and for a new brochure.

## Children learn crafts at agricultural museum

The Ontario Agricultural Museum at Milton is opening its gates once again to children this summer through its summer workshop series. This is a great opportunity for children aged 5 to 13 to participate in an active cultural program at one of Ontario's most picturesque open-air museums.

A program for 5 to 7-year-olds to be offered twice this summer, July 7 to July 11 and August 4 to August 8, will concentrate on themes relating to farming activities. This program will take place from 10 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. at a cost of \$10 per child.

"Apprenticeship Programs" are also being offered twice this summer for older children. The highlight of these programs will be the opportunity to work as an apprentice to the craftsmen that are portrayed at the Museum, or in one of the Museum's restored farmhouses experiencing life as it was in the last century.

The "Apprenticeship Program" will be held July 14, 15 and 16 and August 13, 14, and 15. For children ages 11 to 13 the "Apprenticeship Program" will be held July 23, 24 and 25 and August 18, 19 and 20. These programs will take place from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. daily with a registration fee of \$12 per child.
