

Children learn crafts at agricultural museum

The Ontario Agricultural Museum at Milton is opening its gates once again to children this summer through its summer workshop series. This is a great opportunity for children aged 5 to 13 to participate in an active cultural program at one of Ontario's most picturesque open-air museums.

A program for 5 to 7-year-olds to be offered twice this summer, July 7 to July 11 and August 4 to August 8, will concentrate on themes relating to farming activities. This program will take place from 10 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. at a cost of \$10 per child.

"Apprenticeship Programs" are also being offered twice this summer for older children. The highlight of these programs will be the opportunity to work as an apprentice to the craftsmen that are portrayed at the Museum, or in one of the Museum's restored farmhouses experiencing life as it was in the last century.

"Apprenticeship Program" will be held July 14, 15 and 16 and August 13, 14, and 15. For children ages 11 to 13 the "Apprenticeship Program" will be held July 23, 24 and 25 and August 18, 19 and 20. These programs will take place from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. daily with a registration fee of \$12 per child.


