
### Fastball leaders notch 9-7 victory

# Rockwood halts A's streak



The Rockwood squad recorded a 9-7 win at Prospect Park to improve its record to 11 wins against three losses. With the loss Acton's mark is set at seven wins and six losses, which puts the team in a tie for second spot with Hornby, Both Hornby and Acton have seven games remaining in their regular schedule.

Monday's game was only eight innings in length due to the lights curiew. However, in their half of the final frame the A's had runners at third and second with one out, but couldn't put the deciding runs across

## Over-30 ball hockey


