## Purrs have remedy for Scarlett Fever

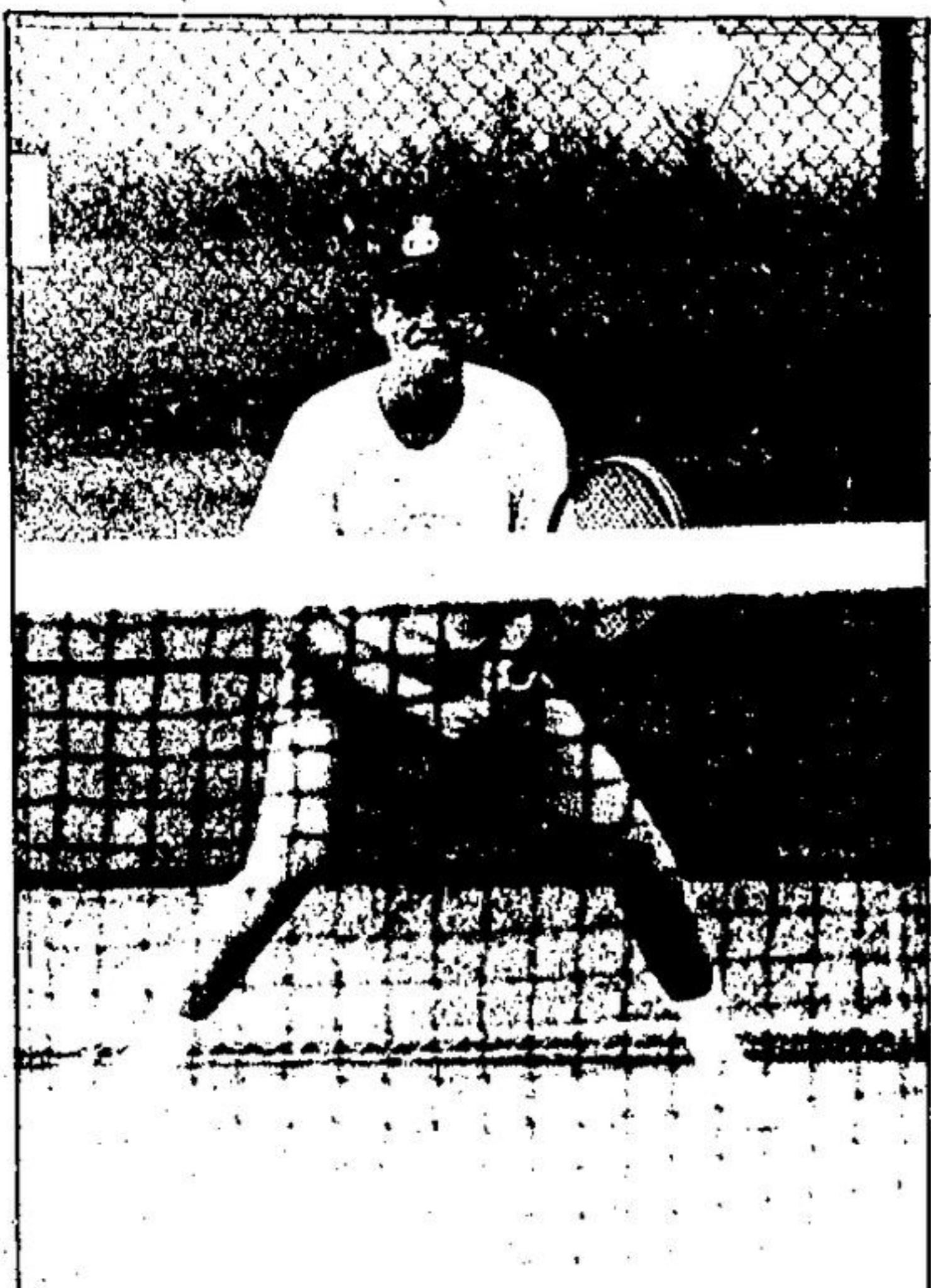
**BLUE PURRS 18**
