WLU taking courses to the people

There is no such thing as the University of Halton Hills, but it is possible to earn university credits at home.

Wilfred Laurier University (WLU) is making that task easier by offering over 20 courses. The university is working with the Halton Hills

Public Libraries where WLU Telecollege courses will be available.

Six residents are needed to form a class. Courses available are in the following areas: anthropology, sociology, business, science, economics, psychology, religion and culture, geography, astronomy and social welfare.

Lectures are on television, TV Ontario or another cable system will broadcast lectures. Tapes of lectures can be borrowed for 24 hours from the library.

The courses will be offered in September. Halton Hills librarian Betsy Cornwell has information on the program and will answer questions about it. She can be reached at 877-2681.

During the term students will be able to speak with their professor by calling a toll-free telephone number. In addition to these talks will be two teleconference calls per term. During these calls the professor teaches the course and students

from centres outside Halton Hills can talk.

This kind of learning is called the "class cluster" concept, and is used throughout Ontario. Clifford Blyea is the director of part-time

studies at Wilfred Laurier.
