## Save your neck, councillors urge

Don't break your neck, save your neck, council says. They want to put up a sign reading "Warning, shallow water, use bridge at own risk" by the paper mill dam in Glen Williams.

Coun. Gerald Rennie said the Credit River is shallow there and the public should be warned diving from the old bridge is prohibited in strong language, such as "Save your neck".

A report from the town engineer this week expresses concern over the old bridge and dam which cross the Credit River and belong to the town.

Bob Austin is worried about possible liability and the safety of persons using the bridge.

The Credit Valley Conservation Authority warned in 1980 that construction work in the area of the dam had partially filled in a scour hole in the river with broken rock. It advised the Region to erect a permanent sign to warn the public.

The Region did put up the signs, but through time, they've disappeared, Mr. Austin's report says.

Monday night, council enacted a bylaw which designates the paper mill dam and bridge over the Credit River as a place "dangerous to travellers". There'll soon be warning signs up, too.

"This is a really good move. Each time I was there in the spring, there were teens in the water," Coun. Marilyn Serjeantson observed.

The Commission has changed its development permit processing procedures to allow the public to address the Commission before any decisions are made on an application.

"This is a giant step to allow public input at the NEC meetings," Coun. Pam Sheldon said.

She said Halton Regional Coun. Joan Little brought the matter up at the Commission upon being named Halton's representative on the NEC,

and this is the result. "I still don't feel they're inviting people with open arms," Coun. Sheldon observed.

You need a majority vote to allow you to speak at an NEC meeting, and then you have a five minute maximum time.
