Acton A's swept their best-of-five Intercounty Fastball League playoff set with Hornby by virtue of the long ball Monday night.

The A's had four home runs in their 7-4 win over Hornby Monday at Prospect Park. The win gave Acton the playoff set in three straight games. Last Tuesday night in Hornby the A's got the scoring parade started with a 19-3 win over the host team.

Acton got started in the first inning when both Roy Spear and Mark Hirtle hit homers with one man on base. After scoring single runs in the sixth and eighth innings, the A's finished the game with three more in the ninth. Hornby's tallies all came in the final inning.

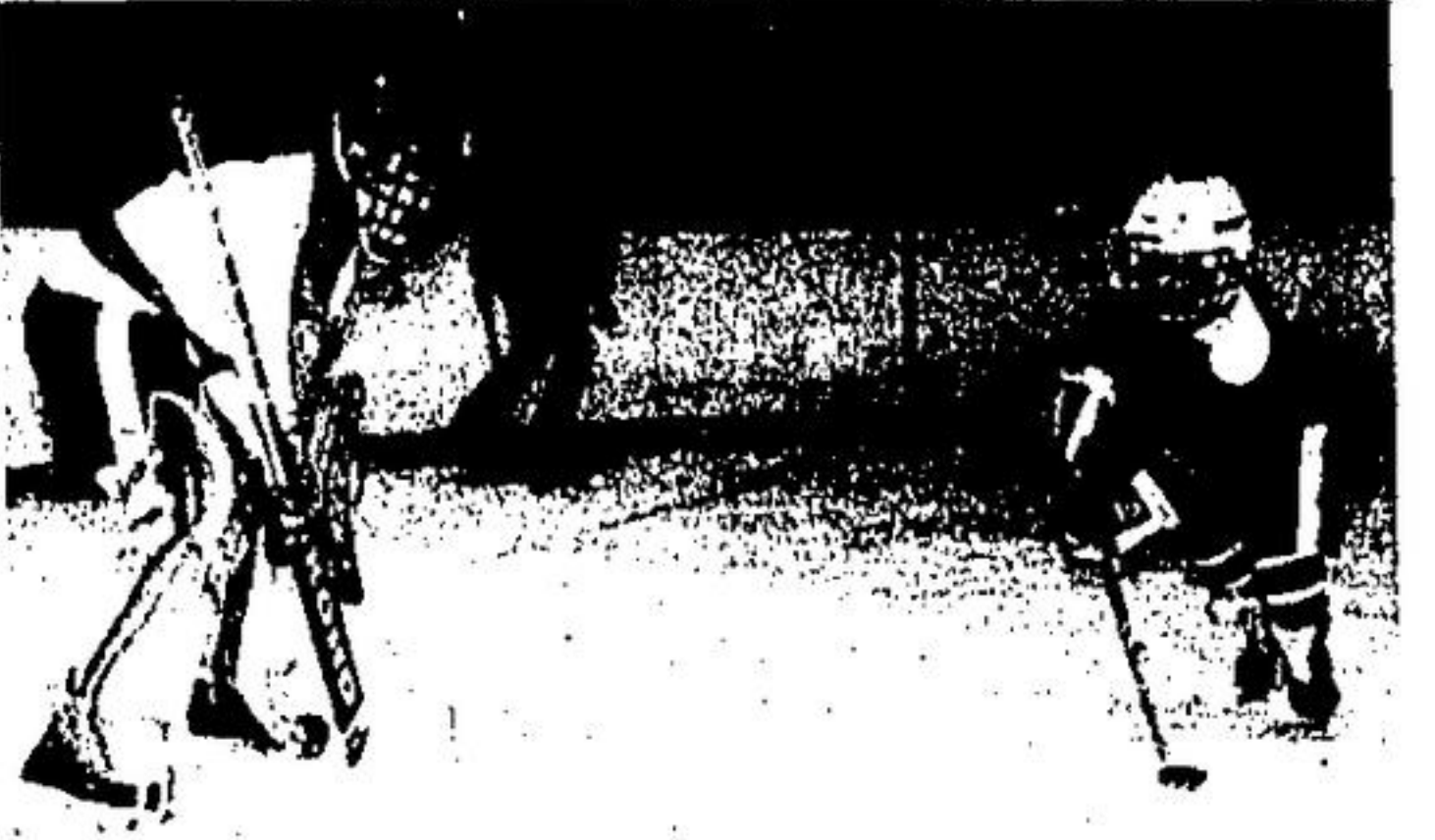
