EGG DROP SOUP

- 4 cups chicken stock
- 1/2 tsp. soy sauce
- 1/2 cup chopped, cooked chicken
- 1/2 cup frozen green peas
- 1/4 cup thinly sliced green onion
- 1 egg, beaten lightly

Bring stock and soy sauce to a boil. Add chicken, peas and onion. Return to boil. Remove from heat and in a slow steady stream drizzle egg into soup. Allow egg to set for 1 minute, then stir gently before ladling soup into bowls. Makes 4 servings.
