Speyside case delay, lawyers can't agree

Disagreements with details of a case to determine a Speyside school's future postponed a Supreme Court of Ontario trial last week.

Justice Marvin Catzman heard from lawyers of the Speyside Area Ratepayers Association (S.A.R.A.) and the Halton Board of Education Oct. 1 and 2. His decision on the school's future now may come in 1996 or in 1987, said Ron Buckton, secretary-treasurer of S.A.R.A.

The ratepayers are challenging methods and arguments of the Board's Halton Hills Consolidation Committee which recommended Speyside Public School be closed. The public school was put up for sale or lease June 5 and is now being leased by the separate board.

The method used to decide the case last week was application. This is different than by trial in that the facts of the case are presented to the judge before the partles have their day in court, said Mr. Buckton.

If a case is presented this way, both parties must agree that the information presented to the judge is accurate and acceptable. When lawyers from S.A.R.A. and the

Board met with Judge Catzman Wednesday both parties were not in total agreement with the facts.

The Board's lawyer pointed out about 15 areas of disagreement in the information, Mr. Buckton said. The judge advised the lawyers to reach an "amiable agreement" on those areas before they returned to court the next day (Wednesday) when the judge would hear the case, Mr. Buckton said. The lawyers returned, but without agreement on

all points. Once the lawyers reach a agreement on the facts of the case the judge will set a new court date. That date could be in 1986, Mr. Buckton

said. If the lawyers do not reach an agreement on the facts then the case will go to trial. This is a longer and more expensive process, Mr. Buckton said. The judge would prefer the dispute be solved by application, Mr. Buckton said.

The legal costs of S.A.R.A. have a ceiling of \$7,500. If the case goes to trial the costs would rise and S.A.R.A. may not pursue it further, Mr. Buckton said.

Duties of the French trustees are no different from those of the other Board trustees Mrs. McCauley said. The French trustees will also be members of the French Language Education Council.

an Oct. 1 meeting of the two parties. The agreement is for Sept. 1, 1986 to August 31, 1988. "It's been quite a few years since


we had a two-year agreement," said Trustee Pat Hillhouse, chairman of the Board Salary Policy Committee.






