The jury of the Here and Now '86 art exhibition presented 94-year-old Frank Black with a special award Oct. 8.

He was one of five artists honored at the cultural centre. An oil on canvas called Afternoon Glow, Newfoundland was Mr. Black's submission. His award was donated by Century 21.

Gary Brunt won an award donated by Frederick and Margaret Helson for his acrylic painting called N.S.B.E.L. Best watercolor painting went to Gretchen Day for Catnap. Gallery House Sol provided the award. An award donated by Bruce

and Margaret Harding went to Vallery Mokrytzki for Elegy to a Goldfish, the best oil painting. And Cindy Carson received an award from Oxbow Books for her best mixed media painting called Strangely Contaminated.

Ms. Carson also received an honorable mention for her mixed media work Chernobyl Beef. Other honorable mentions went to Carol Black for her watercolor Sunday Morning, Reginald Finlayson for his acrylic On the Links and to Fran Koning for a watercolor called Backyards-Kingston.

Artisans receive Wintario grant

A Wintario grant of \$311 has been given to the Credit Valley Artisans to assist with the purchase of craft equipment.

The decision to apply for a Wintario grant came after a very successful spinning workshop sponsored by the Credit Valley Artisans, with Mr. T.A. Carson the instructor. The Artisans found a craft for which there was considerable interest, but they had no equipment. Participants had to rent spinning wheels elsewhere. A project to remedy this situation was begun in May, 1986.

A Wintario grant can be awarded to a maximum of 50 percent of a project's cost if it meets certain criteria and the organization has not received an award within the two years prior to its application. Grants are

awarded each quarter and all projects submitted in that quarter compete for funding.

With the receipt of this grant the Credit Valley Artisans have been able to purchase: 2 Lendrum Spinning Wheels, 2 Leclerc Umbrella Swifts, 2 Ball Winders, 1 pr. Hand Carders, also 1 Bench Grinder for use in stained glass grinding.

The spinning wheels and equipment will be used by the Heritage Handweavers guild and hopefully, instruction in the use of the spinning wheel, will be offered in the near future. The glass grinder will provide the Stained Glass Crafters with greater capacity in the teaching of their craft.
