

Streetsville, Oakville house league champions

House league teams from Streetsville and Oakville took home championship honors in the third annual Georgetown Minor Hockey Association Pee-wee and Atom Hockey tournament held last week at the Alcott Arena.

The tournament was played over two days, with the atoms taking to the ice last Monday. In that tournament Oakville defeated Streetsville 5-3 to capture tournament honors. Milton defeated another team from Oakville to win the consolation championship.

Georgetown had a pair of teams compete in the atom event. The Kinsmen squad defeated Oakville 7-3 in its first game. David Zylstra led the way with four goals and an assist while Jeremiah Fendley chipped in with a pair of goals and an assist. David Kotsos had a goal and four assists while Kevin Taylor and Joey Stephens each had an assist for the winners.

The other local squad Chicken Villa faced Streetsville in its opening match and suffered an 11-0 setback. In the semi final match Kinsmen

met up with Streetsville and came away with a 15-2 defeat. Kotsos had both goals for Georgetown with Fendley and Stephens each drawing assists.

Meanwhile in the consolation semi final Georgetown's Chicken Villa met Oakville and dropped a 7-1 decision. Morgan Keating had the lone goal while Mike Potter had an assist.

The following day the pee-wees took to the ice at the Alcott Arena, with once again a pair of local teams taking part.

In its first game Neil's Music drop-

ped a 5-4 decision to Bolton in a game that featured both an overtime period and a shoot-out. The two teams were tied 4-4 after regulation time and remained as such in overtime. In the Music squad's second game against Flamboro Selects the Flamboro squad came on in the second period to take a 4-2 win. Humphreys had both goals for Georgetown while Fudge and Thain Stansfield drew assists.
