Another \$15,000 is going to be spent on the Prospect Park well project by Halton Region.

Halton's Public Works Director water daily from the Prospect Park well, the new strategy is to draw half

This decision to scale down the amount of water to be drawn came after discussions with the Ministry of the Environment and the Credit Valley Conservation Authority, Mr. Moore says in a report to Regional councillors.

Associates Limited is being recommended to prepare the preliminary design and to review the technology they came up with in a 1963 report on the well. Their previous engineering and negotiations on Hallon behalf with the Ministry are part of the reason Mr. Moore is recommending them for this project.

The Region still hasn't Ministry authority to use Prospect Park well. Mr. Moore said it's because there hasn't been a Ministry okay yet that "a relatively small amount of money" is being spent on the preliminary design. It still runs the risk of being turned down.

He noted Acton needs the water from Prospect Park well in order to supply the water needs of a 10,000 population. The community currently has a population of 7,000 and businesses and politicians want it to grow to to too

The Region will monitor the aquifer (underground river the well draws from) and Black Creek while the well is put into operation and after it is in operation. This monitoring will determine the effect both on Farry Lake and the Black Creek basin of withdrawing water from Prospect Park well


