# Ski racer Fitzsimons tops in her age class

At the age of 13, Georgetown skier Angela Fitzsimons had to make a decision most athletes don't make until years later or not at all. It is a decision many young skiers face.

Angela declined an invitation to ski with the best young skiers in southern Ontario as a member of the Southern Ontario Division.

She skis for the Milton Heights Ski Club out of the Glen Eden Ski Area in Milton. Joining the Southern Ontario Division for young skiers over 14 years old would have meant being in Collingwood Friday during the day and staying the weekend.

The cost to Angela and her family would be more than just the time away from home and school. Board and equipment would have to be paid for, Angela's father, Don Fitzsimons said.

She would need three pairs of skis, for slalom, giant slalom and down hill. Racing suits like those worn by skiers on the Canadian national team would also be needed, Mr. Fitzsimons said.

Although Angela thinks about what it would be like to ski competitively at a higher level, a level that might take her to the provincial or even national team, she realizes she can satisfy her skiing ambitions other ways.

Angela is waiting until she is 16 years old, old enough to teach racing. Another ambition is to teach art at school. The A student enjoys drawing.

In the girls 13 years and under category at the Milton Heights Ski Club, Angela is considered the best skier. That honor was earned at the club's annual competition this season. Last year she was considered second best in that age group.

As a member of Milton's racing team Angela competes against other clubs Jan 10 Angela won the first inter-club race of the year for girls 13 years and under against the Loretto Ski Club.

She attributes her good start this season to the superior condition she is in compared to other years. Angela plays soccer, runs cross-country and also swims. All the practice has made her a better skier. With the team Angela practices one day per week. She will go to the slopes in Milton another two or three days each week.

"I really enjoy it. It's fun," Angela said. One thing that makes her a

good skier is confidence. "People are afraid to go fast because they are afraid of falling. You must lose that fear," Angela said. Practice and trying new things is Angela's key to improvement.

When racing she thinks about getting a good time, winning, technique and staying on her feet. She has been skiing competitively for the Milton Heights Ski Club for four years and still remembers her first fearful

race when she came seventh out of about 15 girls. Since then she has conquered her fear of racing.

She has been skiing since she was 3 years old, when her father would go down a hill holding Angela up between his legs. Mr. Fitzsimons, 41, learned to ski when he was 6 years old.

"Dad (Angela's grandfather) was and probably still is a pretty good skier. He was a skier before it was fashionable," Mr. Fitzsimons said.
