At the age of 13, Georgetown skier Angela Fitzsimons had to make a decision most athletes don't make until years later or not at all. It is a decision many young skiers face.

Angela declined an invitation to ski with the best young skiers in southern Ontario as a member of the Southern Ontario Division. She skis for the Milton Heights Ski

Club out of the Glen Eden Ski Area in Milton. Joining the Southern Ontario Division for young skiers over 14 years old would have meant being in Collingwood Friday during the day and staying the weekend. The cost to Angela and her family

would be more than just the time away from home and school. Board and equipment would have to be paid for, Angela's father, Don Fitzsimons said. She would need three pairs of skis,

for slalom, giant slalom and down hill. Racing suits like those worn by skiers on the Canadian national team would also be needed, Mr. Fitzsimons said

Although Angela thinks about what it would be like to ski competitively at a higher level, a level that might take her to the provincial or even national team, she realizes she can satisfy her skiing ambitions

Angela is waiting until she is 16 years old, old enough to teach racing. Another ambition is to teach art at school The A student enjoys
