

## Police beat

### Minor injuries

A Georgetown man and a Milton man received minor injuries in an accident on Sideroad 10 at the Ninth Line. At 11:20 a.m. the driver of a 1985 Dodge was hit from behind while stopped at an intersection before making a turn onto the Eighth Line, police said.

Gord Hagensen of RR2 Georgetown and Arthur Harrison of 322 McNabb Cres. in Milton were taken to Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital. They were treated and released.

Damage to the 1985 Dodge was estimated at \$7,000. The other car, a 1987 Volkswagen, received \$6,500 damage, police said.

### 3 car crash

An Erin woman who failed to stop at a red light caused a three-car collision on Guelph Street at Sinclair Avenue Thursday.

# No place for garbage if gov't won't renew

Your garbage may be left with nowhere to go June end, if a letter from the Ministry of the Environment is upheld.

Leflerink Disposals Limited and Halton Region have received a letter from the Ministry saying it plans to revoke the licence to operate a temporary transfer station in Halton Hills June 30.

"It puts us in one heck of a position if we're not to have a temporary transfer station," Coun. Pam Sheldon said at Monday night's general committee meeting.

Because the town is more than 45 minutes drive from the Regional landfill, it has been allowed to collect municipal wastes at a site on Armstrong Avenue, compact it, then make the drive down to the sole Halton dump. The Ministry apparently is now saying no to continuation of this practice.

Coun. Sheldon said the Region's chief administrative officer, has been given verbal assurance that the Ministry will renew the temporary transfer station permit, despite the letter.

Councillors passed a motion giving support "in principle" to the Leflerink application for a permanent transfer station in Halton Hills. The motion asks the Ministry to deem that a hearing under the Environmental Protection Act isn't

necessary due to the proven performance of Leflerink, and asks for a further temporary transfer station permit for the Armstrong Avenue site.

Leflerink says it wants a permanent permit to operate the transfer station. This council motion gives the company support in its application to the Ministry.

"This is a horrendous letter from the Ministry, from somebody who just doesn't understand the process," declared Coun. Sheldon. "It's very serious. We could have garbage lining the streets if we don't have a transfer station."

Town Engineer Bob Austin said when an application is made for a

permanent station, the Ministry looks at site plan and discusses fencing and access to the property.

Coun. Betty Fisher said she endorses going for a permanent facility but insisted there be an Environmental Protection Act hearing.

## Library grant

The Georgetown Public Library was one of 114 libraries which received more than \$500,000 from the Ministry of Citizenship and Culture recently.

A grant of \$406 was given to the library to attend the Ontario Library Association and Age-lation conference.
