## Town jumps expansion hurdle

How to meet the water and sewer needs for the development of Georgetown to 40,000 population has been put on paper.

Today (Wednesday), Halton Regional council is expected to approve a development control program which expands the Georgetown Water Pollution Control Plant from three million gallons daily to five.

The Ministry of the Environment required the development control program to evaluate and determine future servicing needs in the community.

Regional Engineer George Woodburn has been working on the \$5,000 program with the Ministry for the past six months.

"We wanted to get the Ministry to approve the concept, so we kept submitting drafts to them so we would know we weren't totally out to lunch," Mr. Woodburn said. Over the past six months, he and other regional staff met with Ministry staff and the Region's consultant Gore and Storrie Limited to come up with a development control program acceptable to all.

Once the Ministry approves this program formally, then Enterac

Property Corporation is free to apply for the final approval of their plan of subdivision in Georgetown south.

The program looks at population projections, sewage flow projections, sewerage works construction programs, water use projections, and water treatment works construction programs. It also identifies special industrial commitments for services which represent a high demand.

Halton recently received a Certificate of Approval to expand the Water Pollution Control Plant to five million gallons daily. Design work to bring the plant to that capacity is underway now by Gore and Storrie.

Approximately \$13 million has been estimated as the cost of the plant expansion. Enterac and the Region are sharing the cost of this construction.

However, Enterac has an escape clause. If the design turns out to be way over the engineer's estimate, the developer isn't committed to carrying out the entire project. Enterac can back out. Mr. Woodburn said negotiations will have to take place if that turns out to be the case.

"We feel this Region desperately needs industrial development so we're picking up the major share of the sewage expansion, and it won't be charged as a levy to future industries," Woodburn said.

### MP defends lumber deal speaking for Pat Carney

A trade negotiation, such as the softwood lumber deal with the United States, is an exercise in sovereignty, claims Brampton-Georgetown MP John McDermid.

The parliamentary secretary to the Minister for International Trade spoke in defence of the softwood lumber deal in the House of Commons recently.

All trade negotiations involve commitment by the participants, Mr. McDermid said. You give up

something to get something.

"Today we are discussing a trade agreement signed between two sovereign countries. Had the countervail gone through, I might be arguing on the other side of this issue," Mr. McDermid said. "I might be arguing that some of our sovereignty was lost because under the American countervail law the Americans have unilateral powers.

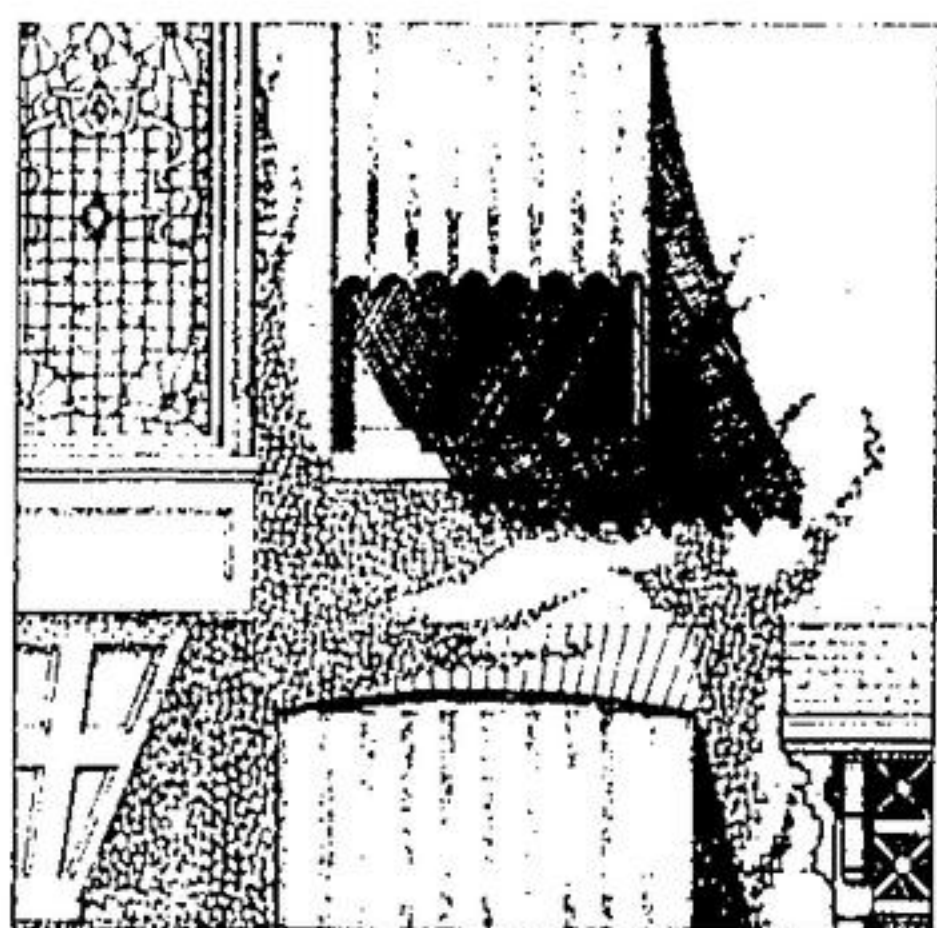
