

## Minor atoms in playoff march

The Mal Dodge Remax Minor Atom 'AA' hockey team defeated Burlington Sunday by a 2-1 score to advance to the next round of playoffs.

The Georgetown team travelled to Burlington on Wednesday night to open the best of three playoff series. Typical of season play the end result was a 7-1 victory for the locals.

Doug Sheppard was the leading offensive weapon as he recorded two goals and had two assists. Stephen Onoprijenko added two goals while singles were scored by Mike Kotsos, Gavin Glaser and

Cory Evans. Two assists were earned by Duane Erier and Mark Aldridge while one each were credited to Jamie Stephenson and Kotsos.

Thursday night at Memorial Arena saw a different Burlington team show up as they checked the Mal Dodge Remax team into the ice.

Burlington scored once in the first and added an early third period goal before Erier counted for the locals from Aldridge and Onoprijenko.

The hard working and tight checking Burlington team hung on

for a well-deserved 2-1 victory on this night's play.

On Sunday the locals scored two first period goals, twenty-two seconds apart, to establish an early lead. Sheppard opened the scoring with assists credited to Kotsos and Erier. Aldridge quickly extended the lead on a goal from Onoprijenko and Sheppard.
