### Councillors cancel to attend functions out in the community

Pull out your calendar. Town council and general committee meeting dates have been changed to accommodate Monday night functions councillors and the Mayor want to attend.

The March 2 general committee meeting has been cancelled altogether to allow the Mayor and councillors to show up for the Hockey Heritage Dinner.

The council meeting on April 27 will be postponed to the following night, April 28, to allow council members to go to a Volunteer Reception being hosted by the town.

A third request, to affect the Feb. 21 council meeting was dropped. The Mayor wanted that date changed so council could attend the reception for the Good Roads Convention.

Cons. Joe Hewitt and Betty Fisher will be attending.

"I'm dead against changing any of the meetings. We have our night to meet and we schedule our weeks around them and those organizations know that," Coun. Pam Johnston said.

Coun. Lillian Bowman agreed, saying these three functions may be important to some councillors, but during the year there may be other functions important to other councillors.

Coun. Rick Bonnette pointed out that over the past four years, council has always changed the Monday night meeting to accommodate the Hockey Heritage Dinner.

Mayor Russ Miller said he will be in an awkward position because he must attend all three of these events representing the town. He was con-

cerned about his attendance, as he has already had to miss a month's worth of meetings because of illness.

"A rule of thumb should be that the business of council takes precedence over everything," Coun. Betty Fisher said. "The only exception I see is the Volunteer Reception because that is the business of council."

### Van for disabled

A new van that can hold a minimum of three wheelchairs is to be purchased by the Acti Van Advisory Committee.

Jan. 27, committee members advised engineer Ted Drowla to draft specifications for tenders for a new van.

The engineer is also to draft a report on starting up a subsidized taxi service as a pilot project for the frail elderly in Acton. Acton residents say they have trouble booking the Acti Van.

There is federal funding available to pay 80 per cent of the cost of a new Acti Van, and the town is applying for this assistance from Transport Canada.

The Ministry of Transportation and Communications will pay 30 per cent of operating costs plus \$2.70 per passenger trip for taxi service to the frail elderly.

The Ministry advises the town to negotiate a flat fee for each intracommunity and intercommunity trip with local taxi companies.

For example, if the flat rate were \$5, the province would pay \$1.50 (30 per cent) and \$2.70, and the balance would be paid by the passenger.
