## Gemini still in hunt for third

The Georgetown Gemini now have a lock on fourth place in the Central Junior B hockey league, and they didn't even have to take to the ice to assure it.

In Central hockey action Tuesday night, the Burlington Cougars defeated the Vaughan Raiders 5-3. The Raiders have now completed their 42-game schedule with a record of 15 wins, 16 losses, and 10 ties for 42 points, which leaves

them two points behind the Gemini.

Georgetown's sights are now set on trying to overtake the Cougars.

Burlington is presently in third place in the eight-team league with a record of 21 wins, 14 losses, and five ties for 47 points.

The Gems have 44 points on 19 wins, 15 losses, and six ties, and like the Cougars, have two games remaining in the regular schedule.

Tonight, (Friday) the Gems will travel to Oakville for an 8 p.m. contest, while the Cougars entertain the Nobleton Devils in Burlington.

Then Saturday at the Gordon Alcott Arena, the Gems will host the Cougars for a contest which might ultimately decide third and fourth place.

The bottom line is the Gems must win both their final games, and count on the Devils to at least tie the Cougars Friday night.

To this point in the season, Burlington and Georgetown are tied in head-to-head play with two wins each and a tie, so Saturday's game

will be the rubber match. If the two teams are tied in the standings, the winner of Saturday's match will be awarded third place.

The Barrie Colts will easily finish in first place, after accumulating 65 points with two games left to play.

The Oakville Blades, despite losing to Milton 6-3 Tuesday, have wrapped up second with 52 points, prior to their final encounter with the Gems.

Game time for the Burlington - Georgetown match-up at the Alcott Arena Saturday is 7:30 p.m.

It is time once again for the Halton Hills Recreation and Parks Department to begin planning our sports field schedules for 1987. To help us with preparing our schedules we will need to know if you or your group will require use of any of our fields during the 1987 season.

Town of Halton Hills groups or individuals interested in obtaining an outdoor sport facility on a regular basis for the 1987 summer season are asked to submit a request form (which can be picked up at the Recreation and Parks Office) indicating:

- The type of facility required (i.e. softball diamond, soccer field).
  - The preferred location of the facility required (i.e. Georgetown, Acton, Linthouse).
  - The length of time the facility is required (i.e. June to August).
  - The day the facility is required plus an alternate date (i.e. 1st choice - Monday; 2nd choice - Tuesday).
  - The time of day required (the standard evening booking is 6:30 to 8:15 p.m.).
  - The nature of the group requiring the facility (i.e. youth, adult, recreational ball).
  - The applicant's name, address and phone number (both home and business).
- Requests should be dropped off at the Recreation and Parks Office, 25 James Street, Georgetown

or mailed immediately to: Recreation Supervisor of Park Bookings, P.O. Box 128, Halton Hills (Georgetown), Ontario, L7G 4T1.

Requests will be reviewed on the basis of when they are received by our department in relationship to the availability of facilities with priority given to affiliated minor groups, affiliated adult groups and previous years' users.

Regular users are reminded that the deadline for submission is Friday, Feb. 20 so be sure to get your requests in now.

Teams are reminded that practice time will be issued only through the league's contact person for the department, when available, and must be requested.



## Photo Tips

**WINTER SHOOTING PART 2**

**Film and Cold Weather:** Film and very cold weather present the photographer with an unusual problem. In extreme cold, film turns very brittle, and is liable to crack or break in half. Also, cold weather lacks a great deal of humidity and therefore if you rewind or advance your film too rapidly the film will be likely to crack and secondly, strange "Lightning Bolt" shaped marks are likely to appear on your processed film. These bolts of lightning are actually static electricity marks caused by rapid winding of the film in the low humidity, cold conditions. If you use a motor-drive or power winder on your camera you might consider leaving it at home in the very cold weather. If, however, you are shooting sports or winter action you will have to chance it. Remember rewind slowly and carry extra batteries (warm-ed, of course) for your motor.

**What To Shoot:** Winter hoar frost early in the morning paints tree branches, barn roofs and evergreens with an eerie webbing of lacework that will glow in the backlight of winter sunrise. Look for unusual patterns in snowdrifts and embankments. Bushes frozen and stark, still standing in now iced-over ponds. A lone horse standing or frisking in a paddock. The family shovelling the proverbial driveway, or better still, having a snowball fight or making a snowman. The neighbourhood kids playing shinny hockey on a homemade rink. Iceicles! Cold blue skies with puffy white clouds, or the bleak but splendid setting of the winter sun. Once you have taken your winter precautions the list is endless. Remember to overexpose your shots if you wish your snow to be reproduced as white.

**Do I Use A Tripod?:** Photography on a tripod is always where possible or desirable. Admittedly, a tripod can be awkward to carry, especially in the cold. However, it is well worth the inconvenience when you consider that the use of one will reduce camera "shake" and also help correct composition problems such as tilted horizons. Oh yes, if you are going to take your tripod, take your cable release with you, it will also reduce that problem of shake. Now that you are better prepared and all geared up, dress warmly, and good shooting. Until next week.
