Freewheelin' Franklin reveals the many joys of juggling

There are better ways of becoming "the life of the party" than donning a lamp shade and dancing the rumba with a broom, and the Halton Hills Recreation and Parks Department has just the answer.

The department is sponsoring a one-night workshop on juggling March 17, which features instruction by Franklin Hargraves, who is from Wilno, near Kingston.

Hargraves, or 'Freewheelin' Franklin' as he's known in juggling circles - is well known, not only as a juggler, but also as a comedian, a magician, and a balloon sculptor. He is a member of the International Jugglers' Association, the Society of American Magicians and Clowns Canada.



Freewheelin' has performed in stage shows and as a wandering minstrel of mirth, in theatres and parks, at picnics and fairs, and at shopping centres, libraries and schools.

His enthusiasm on the stage carries through into the audience and captivates young and old alike.

But not only is Freewheelin' Franklin enjoyable to watch on stage, he also shares his juggling expertise with others.

On Tuesday, March 17, at the Cedarvale Community Centre, Halton Hills residents of all ages will have the opportunity to meet the intriguing Freewheelin' Franklin and learn some juggling acts of their own.

A special workshop for children runs from 7:30 - 8:15 p.m. at a cost of \$4 per participant.

For adults, Freewheelin' will be available between 8:30 and 9:30 p.m. for a workshop costing \$8 per person.

Tickets for the game are \$6 each, which entitles purchasers to a crested souvenir puck, and official souvenir program.

At last count, there were only 50 tickets left for sale, and there will be none available at the arena.

Among the Red Wing alumni are Gary Bergman, Bobby Kromm, Alex Delvecchio, Nick Libett, Dennis Hestall, Mickey Redman, and of course, No. 9 himself, Gordie Howe.

All proceeds raised through the game will be donated to the Easter Seal Society.
