### IN ONTARIO PROVINCIAL ELECTIONS

The Ontario Election Act, provides that every person is entitled to vote who, on Election Day, has attained eighteen years of age; is a Canadian Citizen; has resided in Ontario for the six months next preceding Election Day; and is not disqualified by law from voting.

British Subjects who are not Canadian Citizens do not have the right to vote in Ontario Provincial Elections.
