Jackson h.s. edges out our Kiwanis entry

 They may have been intimidated at first, but Georgetown District High School's concert choir soon met the challenges of the 44th annual Kiwanis Music Festival of Greater Toronto Tuesday.

Performing in the massive Metropolitan United Church in Toronto, the 30-member choir placed second, receiving a mark of 87 per cent. Oakville Trafalgar High School, the only other Halton school in the festival, tied with Georgetown, A.Y. Jackson High School, from Toronto, narrowly edged out GDHS and O.T. by receiving a mark of 88 per cent, giving them the winning certificate.

The Kiwanis Music Festival is a yearly endeavor sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Metropolitan Toronto. This is the first year that a concert choir even existed at GDHS, which makes their second place finish in this prestigious festival even more impressive. The GDHS Wind Ensemble competed Monday in the same festival, which is open to all high school musical groups in the Greater Toronto area. There are over 30 different divisions to the festival.

Under the direction of Katie Kirkup-Ortalon, a music teacher at Georgetown District High School, the choir performed two pieces before a professional adjudicator, a professor of music at the University of Western Ontario, and a specialist in vocal music.

The choir started with "See The Baby", a rhythmic Christmas song, which was compulsory by festival rules. The second piece, a mellow, free-flowing song entitled "Trav'ler", was chosen by Mrs. Kirkup-Ortalon for the group.

Monica Ramakers, a student participant in the festival, summed up the attitude of most of the singers by saying, "I felt that the experience was beneficial, because, in the competitive sense, it gave us something to work towards as a group."

Mrs. Kirkup-Ortalon was extremely pleased and proud of the choir. "I think they've done a wonderful job. The adjudicator felt that we were very musical, with elements such as dynamic contrast and energy, but need a bit more work on precision."

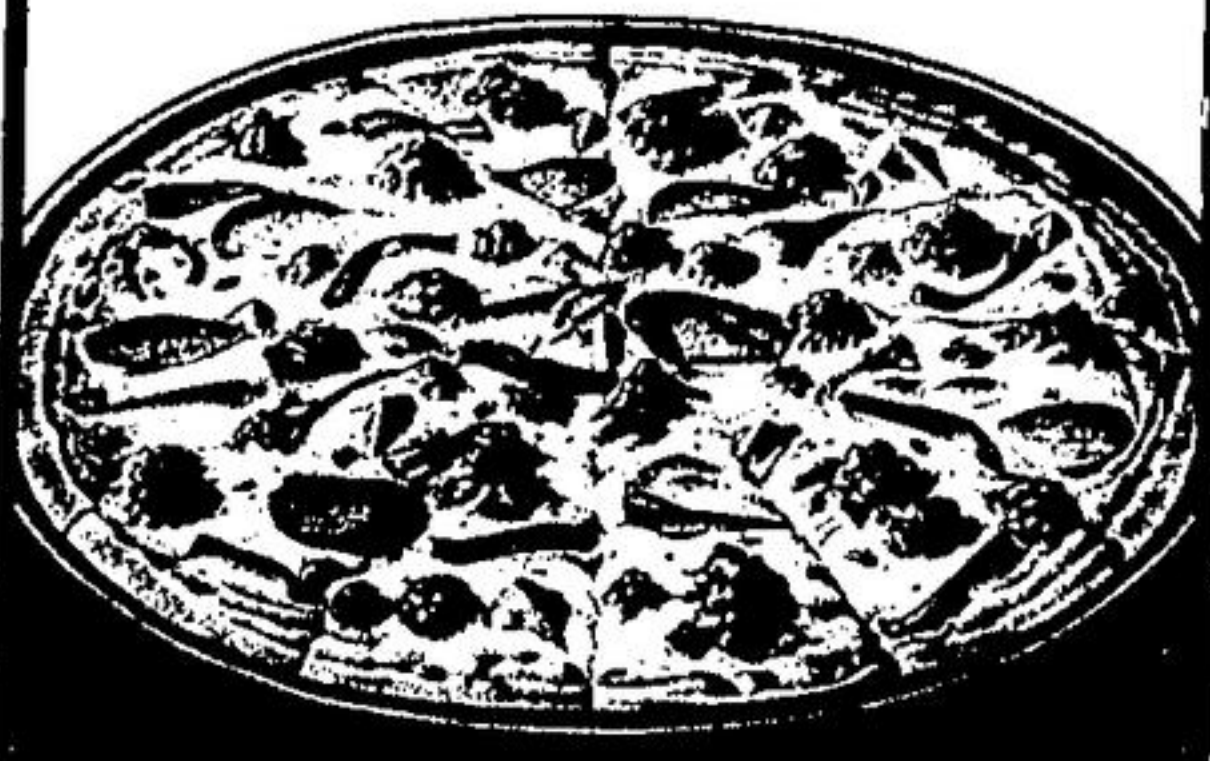
