Ballinafad Hall nets a \$15,000 gov't grant

The Ballinafad Community Hall addition got \$15,000 from the town, despite a comment from the town's recreation director that he would prefer that that money be spent to house the Credit Valley Artisans.

Erin's administrator-clerk Murray Clarke asked for the money Friday afternoon, of budget committee members. The \$126,000 addition is to be officially opened on Canada Day, July 1, he said.

The hall is popular with area residents and the rental books show Halton Hills residents represent 76 per cent of the rentals.

The hall board has received provincial grants and grants from Erin Township. As well, area residents have raised funds for the project.

Recreation Director Tom Shepard said he had no difficulty in the town giving the group a \$15,000 one-time-only grant, but questioned whether the amount should be paid in one lumpsum.

Coun. Betty Fisher asked how this expenditure by the town would stack up to fixing the Cedarvale Park Cottage. The Cottage is the former home of the Credit Valley Artisans.

The Artisans were told to vacate the older building in December, due to safety concerns.

"If it was my priority, it would be the Cottage. However, I'm told a lot of residents use the Ballinafad hall I accept it," Mr. Shepard said.
