for the upcoming season, according "We're looking at the possibility of having an inter-locking schedule with other leagues. The boys will have the opportunity to play different teams, than they have in the past. It doesn't necessarily mean they'll play more games, but they'll have more variety."

Ridley says the details of the pro-posal are being considered by officials of the Central Ontario Baseball Association.

of the biggest changes this season will be the implementation of "pitched ball" for the squirt division. In the past, the eight and nine-yearolds have played t-ball, but Ridley says this season they will be futting a ball pitched by their coach, or some other impartial adult, who won't be

In the overall picture, Ridley says the GBA is in good shape in terms of what they have accomplished to


