Stewarttown suffers first loss

Week 5 in the North Halton Basketball League produced the first loss of the season for Stewarttown in the boys' division, as they fell 25-19 to Centennial.

In the girls' division, Stewarttown remained in firm control as they ran their undefeated record to six wins without a loss.

In other boys' action, Sherratt beat Brookville 39-34, as Josh Garnley had 14 and Glenn Treckey had eight for the winners. In a losing cause, Dion Comba had 12, while James Postma had 10.

Centennial and Stewarttown are now tied in the standings of the boys division with identical marks of five wins and one loss, for 16 points each.

W.I. Dick is in third with nine points, on two wins and three losses, while Sherratt is fourth with six points on one win and three losses, and Brookville is fifth as they've gone winless in four starts to collect four points.

In the girls' division, Stewarttown chalked up their sixth straight win by downing Centennial 37-20.

Another contest, which was scheduled to be played between Brookville and Sherratt had to be cancelled.

Stewarttown's record leaves them on top with 18 points.

Tied for second with 10 points each are Centennial with a record of two wins and four losses and Sherratt, with three wins and one loss.

Brookville is fourth with nine points on two wins and three losses, while W.I. Dick is winless in five starts and has five points.

The Halton semifinals will be held March 10, with the Halton finals scheduled for March 12 at E.C. Drury High School in Milton.
