Group combats sex assaults

Dear Sir,
You are probably well aware of the saddening amount of violence that pervades today's society. Day after day, you read about it in the newspapers or see it on the television. This significant social problem can result in feelings of both anger and frustration. One aspect of this problem that specifically concerns women is that of sexual assault.

The statistics relating to sexual assault are alarming:

- 1 in 4 women in Canada is sexually assaulted in some way.

- a woman is sexually assaulted every six minutes in Canada.

- victims of reported sexual assault range in age from 6 months to 90 years.

- 49 per cent of all sexual assaults occur in broad daylight.

Here in Halton, a group of concerned women has positively channelled their feelings of anger and frustration by forming an organization to assist victims of sexual assault - SASH - Sexual Assault Services of Halton. SASH is being organized and operated under the auspices of Halton Women's Place - a temporary residence for physically and emotionally abused women and their children.

Our mission is to provide immediate and confidential support to sexual assault survivors with a 24-hour crisis line. We are qualified to give information relating to the medical, legal and psychological aspects of sexual assault, as well as referrals to doctors, emergency wards and other counsellors and lawyers.

We also accompany the women to the hospital or court, as well as providing information and education

services to the public. We are asking for your help. SASH needs both financial and volunteer support. Donations last year covered the cost of two volunteer training programs. The continued training and the growth of SASH's services will depend upon your contribution and involvement. Your donation will be greatly appreciated. Make your cheque payable to:

There is a need for this type of service in Halton. Sexual assault does not just happen to people you don't know. Last year there were 99 reported cases of sexual assault in Halton (it is believed that only 1 in 10 cases are reported to police).
